January 19, 2020 Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 49: 3, 5-6

The prophet presents himself as another Jeremiah, with references to having a call while still in the womb, and his obligation to fulfill it. He knows that he is to be "a light to the nations" with his announcements.

Reading II: I Corinthians 1: 1-3

Paul uses a standard letter introduction, and then claims to have the same apostolic authority as the original Twelve. He tells his readers that they have been set apart by God and must work to be worthy of that.

The Gospel: John 1: 29-34

The writer tells his readers that the descent of the Spirit upon Jesus was the sign for John the Baptist that He was the one designated by God. He is "the Lamb of God" with all the rich meaning of that term making Him the ultimate sacrifice for our sins.

St. Agnes
Feast Day: January 21st

Legend has it that Agnes was a beautiful girl whom many young men wanted to marry. Among those she refused, one reported her to the authorities for being a Christian. Agnes was condemned, executed, and buried near Rome in a catacomb that eventually was named after her. The daughter of Constantine built a basilica in her honor.

Like that of Maria Goretti in the 20th century, the martyrdom of a virginal young girl made a deep impression on a society enslaved to a materialistic outlook. Also like Agatha, who died in similar circumstances, Agnes is a symbol that holiness does not depend on length of years, experience, or human effort. It is a gift God offers to all.

FISCAL CORNER

As of week 15 of the Parish appeal, 319 families have contributed \$128,900 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 85.93% of this year's goal. We are behind last year's pace by \$5,915 and have \$21,100 to go to meet our goal. This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January, so there is not much time left to meet our goal. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. The Catholic bishops of the United States have designated January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, directs:

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

As St. James tells us, 'be quick to listen, slow to speak and anger'; we must respond with the love and compassion of Christ; how would Jesus respond? What would He say? Next Friday, Jan. 24, 2020 will be the 46th Anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion at any time throughout pregnancy up until delivery for any reason. This decision is an unjust law. It is not supported by any aspect of our Constitution, so, aside from being immoral in that it takes the life of another, it is unethical for those who perform such as they take an oath to protect life. 


