

July 19, 2020 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Wisdom 12: 13, 16-19

God, being omnipotent, can also be just and merciful. His justice does not exclude His kindness. An uplifting truth for us, coupled with the fact that God desires us to repent of our sins, which adds hope to our belief.

Reading II: Romans 8: 26-27

Through the Spirit, the Christian becomes a child of God, and is thus entitled to the Spirit's help in living with his weakness.

The Gospel: Matthew 13: 24-43, or 13: 24-30

Here is the first set of parables explicitly about the kingdom of God. He points out the power even of a small movement from God when it affects the whole of a society. Note here too the impartiality of Jesus, with His inclusion of a man and a woman in successive stories.

This is natural family planning awareness week. This week commemorates the July 25, 1968 release of the Pope St. Paul VI encyclical Humane Vitae speaking to the true meaning of human sexuality,

family planning, responsible parenthood and affirming 2000- year teaching on prohibitions against contraception. This day is also the feast day of St. James the Apostle and precedes the feast day of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus. When was the last time you heard a homily on contraception? Abortion? Family planning? Responsible parenthood? They are very few and far between, if at all. Why? There is no question about Church teaching. There is no controversary as it is settled magisterial infallible teaching by several Popes in the past century. Yes, 85% of Catholics contracept and sterilize at the same rate as non-Catholics! Is it because such homilies/teachings may antagonize parishioners? Irritate them? Not appropriate for all audiences? After all, children and elderly will be present. This is the 58th anniversary of that encyclical which is probably the most controversial of all encyclicals ever written and not well received by many in the Church. To help us answer these questions and more, Pope St. JP II gave us Theology of the Body and Catholics need to learn the meaning of the body and the meaning of human sexuality and God's plan for life and love.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

Respect "Married love differs from any other love in the world. By its nature, the love of husband and wife is so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with God and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being they will love and care for together. ... That power to create a new life with God is at the heart of what spouses share with each other." This power is given as gift and is not to be assumed and cannot be avoided or overtaken! Marital love between a man and a woman is an example of the type of 'communion love' shared by the Persons of the Trinity and what we all long for that we had in the Garden and lost with sin. This is Natural Family Planning Awareness Week. In addition to be a memorial to Pope St. Paul VI's watershed encyclical Humane Vitae which encompasses unchangeable Catholic Church teaching against contraception of any type for any reason, it celebrates what type of family planning and responsible parenthood God HAS given us to prayerfully and properly discern our family size through natural means which God has designed in our very physical persons. There will be NO marriage in Heaven, because marriage is a 'signpost' if you will of the type of communion we will have in Heaven with the Trinity and once we have it, there will be no need for 'signposts'.
