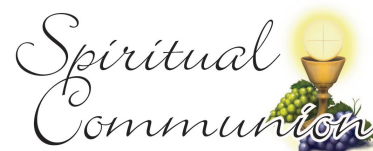

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

July is the seventh month of the year and the fourth of seven months to have a length of 31 days. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Julius Caesar, it being the month of his birth. Monday, July 1 was the feast day

of St. Junipero Serra whose statue was recently displaced by an angry mob in CA despite the fact that he founded the first missions in CA to protect the indigenous people in that area against those oppressing them. July 3 was the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle- he who doubted and evangelized India. July 4, the feast of St. Elizabeth of Hungary; July 6, we have the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr; July 11, the feast day of St. Benedict who founded the monastic rule and gave us the Benedictine Order; July 14, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American canonized saint; July 16, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel; July 21, St. Lawrence Brindisi, priest and doctor; July 22, St. Mary Magdalene; July 25, the feast of St. James the Apostle and the anniversary of Humane Vitae giving us Church teaching on human sexuality/contraception/ responsible parenthood and family planning; July 26, feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus; July 29, feast day of St. Martha and finally July 31, feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola. An all star banner month, this month that starts with Independence day celebrating the birth of our nation and such freedom of will and faith as manifested by the saints we celebrate.

On another note, it is looking like we may have to postpone our planned programs for the Fall as that will be dictated by our facilities and our ability to meet in groups and maintain appropriate restrictions for COVID-19. This will be finalized by August.

There is a lot going on in our society right now as we are in the midst of celebrating Independence Day weekend over July 4. This day memorializes the Declaration of Independence and the birth of our nation as an independent nation. “We hold these truths to be self-evident that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.” The caps are in the original document. There are several references to God and the Creator. The first inalienable right mentioned is the right to LIFE without which NONE of the other rights would have any meaning. ECONOMIC RESOURCES:

Pennsylvania Unemployment Compensation: You may be eligible for unemployment if your employer has closed due to COVID-19, your hours have been reduced, you have been told not to work, or have been told to isolate or self-quarantine. Important to note, is that under the federal economic stimulus law, state unemployment benefits are increased by up to \$600/month for 4 months through July 31st, and unemployment is now available for up to 39 weeks. Self-employed, independent contractors and freelancers also may be eligible.

Direct Cash Payments: Under the federal economic stimulus law, you will receive a direct payment of \$1,200 if you earn \$75,000 or less, or \$2,400 if you and your spouse make up to \$150,000. Each dependent child increases the amount by an additional \$500. The amount decreases for individuals with incomes above \$75,000, and payments cut off for those above \$99,000. Payments are expected to be direct deposited by the end of April; but if mailed, receipt will take longer.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program: Low-income homeowners (\$35,000 or less) or renters (\$15,000 or less) may be eligible for a property tax or rent rebate of between \$250-\$650 for property taxes/rent paid in 2019. Federal and State Income Tax Filing Deadlines: Extended to July 15th

Federal Student Loans: You will not have to pay your federal student loans (loans held by the U.S. Department of Education) for 6 months through September 30th, and interest will not accrue. This provision does not apply to private student loans, so please check with your lender.

FOOD RESOURCES:

SNAP Benefits/Food Stamps: You may be eligible for SNAP benefits (food stamps) to help buy food and groceries, due to a job loss/loss of income from the coronavirus pandemic. However, there are income limits, based on family size-- the chart is on the right side of the link below. You can apply online: <https://www.dhs.pa.gov/Services/Assistance/Pages/SNAP.aspx> Now you can also use SNAP to purchase groceries at some online retailers.

Mary's Cupboard Food Pantry: Offers food/groceries to those in need; open Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m.-Noon; **Catholic Social Services Diaper Pantry:** Open Thursdays from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Please call 215-945-2550 for more information and to make an appointment first.
