

June 14, 2020 The Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord

Reading I: Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14b-16a

The writer looks back to the past of his people and recalls the manna by which God fed His people. He concludes that "not by bread alone does one live," but by the Word of God.

Reading II: I Corinthians 10: 16-17

Our sharing in the one cup and one loaf of bread forges the unity that we believers have, and this sharing makes us one body.

The Gospel: John 6: 51-58

A relationship exists between the believer and Our Lord Jesus that is established by the Holy Eucharist. There is a sharp distinction between the community that possesses "the bread of life," and the ancients, who had only the manna.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO OUR PARISH!

Yes. It's already the summer of our 100th year as a parish. Just 6 months ago, Archbishop Chaput opened our Centennial Celebration and encouraged us to look back with joy and to look forward with hope. Then, 5 months ago our parish Knights of Columbus announced plans to publish a book of memories. January, February, and March saw hundreds of parishioners, friends, and former parishioners, submit their 17 syllable haikus to share their joys, thanks, and tributes for the blessings they have experienced here. After the editing and printing of the book in May, "A Hundred Haikus or More" is now ready to be distributed and enjoyed by all of our parish. As we announced in January, a donation of \$10. for a copy will secure for your family a copy to cherish and remember. Please note that only 300 copies of the book have been printed. The Knights of Columbus will be helping to provide these 300 copies on a first come, first served, basis after all the masses next weekend on June 13, 14. Your \$10 donation will be a part of a \$3000 birthday gift our Knights of Columbus Council hopes to present to the parish before the closing Mass and parish picnic. Plan now to secure your copy. We know that reading the memories submitted by our Moms and Dads, our students and alumni, our life-long parishioners and our many friends in Yardley and beyond, will please, you, amuse you, remind you, and surprise you. If your haiku is included, don't miss out on having your own copy. Whether or not your haiku is included, we hope you will enjoy sharing the thoughts of others as we all look with hope to our next 100 years.



Today we celebrate the solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Sacred Body of Christ. Traditionally celebrated on the second Thursday after Whit Sunday (actually Pentecost Sunday, but Whit in Britain and

Ireland), Corpus Christi is a Catholic holiday that celebrates the presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the Eucharist (this year June 11) but celebrated today. In commemoration of the Last Supper, many Catholics receive Holy Communion this day. This holy day has been celebrated since 1246 when Bishop of Liege, Bishop Robert de Torote was persuaded by St. Juliana to initiate a feast because of a vision she had received. Pope Urban VI ordered the whole Church to celebrate the feast in 1261. There is usually a procession led by carrying of the Monstrance containing the Eucharist through towns and neighborhoods. The Pew Research center estimates that just 31% of 'proclaimed' Catholics believe in transubstantiation where the substances of bread and wine are 'transubstantiated' into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Most believe that they are just 'symbols' of Christ and many don't know what the Church teaches. Think about one item for a moment... if one TRULY believed that the bread and wine became the Body/Blood/Soul/Divinity of Christ – would you 'show up'? how would you dress? How would you act? How would you speak? What would be different? Would you receive the Eucharist if you were not 'worthy' (i.e. in a state of mortal sin)? If you have not signed up for 'flocknote' please do so as the parish is trying to accumulate emails to notify parishioners of important events and announcements.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

Respect Our relationship with Christ—strengthened by receivife ing him worthily in Holy Communion—helps us understand our relationships with one another and with creation. Perhaps now we understand why many of us were so upset over not being able to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. If we had a strong relationship with Jesus, we understand why we were 'pining' for His communion in our lives; for those not, perhaps now a stronger relationship. Perhaps, absence DOES make the 'heart grow fonder'. Perhaps, we took 'for granted' that gift and in its absence realized what we were missing. Perhaps the pandemic, all politics aside, had a much deeper meaning that is a little different for each of us as our 'sufferings' were all different whether they were spiritual, physical, economic or relational (family deprivation). Let us ponder on the meaning of life; the gifts of life; the gifts of 'inalienable rights' within our Constitution, i.e. life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; freedom of religion! Gifts given by God bestowed on His children all because we are all created in His image and likeness. Quite often we don't realize what we have until we lose it.


FATHER McCAFFERTY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

How much does a niche cost?

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300

How can I arrange to purchase a niche?

You may contact the Rectory at 215-493-3377 to make an appointment to purchase. Upon final payment, a certificate covering inumment ownership rights will be sent to the purchaser of the niche.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- Spiritual Site for Final Resting The principal benefit a
 Columbarium affords church members and their families the
 opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish
 cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives,
 a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones
 can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.
- Simplicity of Planning The purchase of a Columbarium niche eliminates the pressures of choosing a burial site, casket, vault and monument; also, there is no need to plan for inurnment and memorial services at different locations and times.
- Substantial Financial Savings With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.
