

June 21, 2020 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Jeremiah 20: 10-13

In the midst of the prophet's gloomy mood, there comes this passage, expressing his deep confidence in the Lord's strength and protection. He is "like a mighty champion."

Reading II: Romans 5: 12-15

Adam, one man, brought sin into the world. Jesus, one new man, brought God's grace into the world. By Him, all people can be saved.

The Gospel: Matthew 10: 26-33

This passage, part of Christ's "Mission Discourse," speaks of appropriate versus inappropriate fear. In their somewhat frightening new task of preaching, the Twelve listen as Jesus allays their fears. He tells them to "fear no one." even those who might kill you in body but not the soul."



Today we celebrate the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (actually Fri June 19). Today we also celebrate Father's Day. The feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is a liturgical solemnity that falls 19 days after Pentecost on a Friday. The devotion is one of the most widely practice and well- known Catholic devotions taking Jesus Christ's physical heart as the representation

of His Divine love for humanity. The feast can be traced to the 11th century. It marked the spirituality of St. Bernard of Clairvaux in the 12th century and of St. Bonaventure and St. Gertrude the Great in the 13th century. The very first liturgical feast was celebrated in 1670 through the efforts of St. John Eudes. In 1856 Pope Pius IX established the feast as obligatory for the whole church. The feast is also a special day of prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.

Father's day is a day honoring fatherhood and paternal bonds as well as the influence of fathers in society. It was founded in America by Sonora Smart Dodd in 1910. It does, however, date back to 1508 when it was celebrated on the feast of St. Joseph March 19. No small coincidence that these two are celebrated today! Let all fathers dedicate their fatherhood to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and His father, St. Joseph and pray for the strength to be the leaders/providers and protectors they were called to be. One of the more common problems of contemporary society is the absence of fathers from the home, whether it be physical/emotional/spiritual/economic presence which can lead to fragmentation of families and poor mentorship for sons/future men! 1 in 4 children currently live without a father in the home, leading to 63% of all youth suicides, 90% of all runaway and homeless youths, 85% of all children with behavioral disorders and 71% of all high school dropouts. Let us pray for fathers including those of children in the womb.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us. Sacred Heart of Jesus pray for us.

"Through our prayers and through the intercession of St. Joseph, patron of fathers, may fathers come to know the irreplaceable role they hold in the lives of their children, and the responsibility they share in



welcoming God's gift of new life! Many of us can celebrate our fathers because they are still with us, although we may still be in some separation because of pandemic restrictions; many of us do not have our fathers with us-

we can still pray to them, for them and celebrate with memories their fatherhood and their 'yes' to our lives! Many in the prolife movement are very much into saving the babies and helping the moms, but oft times the fathers are absent or forgotten. We need to pray for those men; we need to support them too and call them to pray to St. Joseph for the strength and the courage to do what St. Joseph did- stand up for, support and provide and protect and love his betrothed who unexpectedly conceived during their engagement, and 'adopted' Jesus as his own son and led Him into the man Our Lord became so He could be Father to us all! Thank you, St. Joseph; thanks to all fathers. We celebrate you today. We honor you. We remember you. ALL of us have fathers. Thanks to our Heavenly Father for the gift of life and the gift of Fatherhood.


