The new Christian life, according to Paul, brings about a freedom from sin and death. He compares our first parent Adam with Christ, the new Adam and the head of a new humanity.


Gospel: Matthew 4: 1-11

This month we celebrate the 25th anniversary of the papal encyclical Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life). This Church teaching on the value and inviolability of every human life remains an indispensable source of

truth for all people. Written by Pope St. John Paul II, Evangelium vitae was appropriately given in Rome on the Solemnity of the Annunciation on March 25, 1995.

Pope St. JP II wrote this encyclical in 1995 to answer many questions about science, ethics, morality and medical advances to which the Catholic Church needed to respond. It is amazing that our Catholic Church has answers to our many questions. This Pope served in his papacy for 26 years and wrote more on human sexuality and intimacy than all other popes combined since Peter. Encyclicals are letters written by Popes to all Bishops of the Catholic Church. These letters are one of the highest forms of communication by the pope and usually deals with some aspect of Catholic teaching- clarifying, amplifying, condemning or promoting one or a number of issues. The encyclical of Humani Generis of Pope Pius XII states that (unless explicitly stated) papal encyclicals are not infallible documents but are teachings that Catholic theologians must follow: "nor must it be thought that what is expounded in Encyclical letters does not of itself demand consent...". However, teachings elucidated by the Pope, consistent with Church teaching consistent with Sacred Scripture and Tradition are considered within the teaching charism of the Magisterium of the Catholic Church whose teachings on Doctrine and Dogma are infallible. Try reading one. They are all available at Vatican.org.

This month is the 25th anniversary of Evangelium Vitae – the Gospel of Life by Pope St. JP II. "[The Gospel of Life] is therefore meant to be a precise and vigs reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability, and

orous reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability, and at the same time a pressing appeal addressed to each and every person, in the name of God: respect, protect, love and serve life, every human life! Only in this direction will you find justice, development, true freedom, peace and happiness!" (The Gospel of Life 5). This encyclical was written in response to events going on in science and technology (first 'test-tube' baby; advances in contraception, IVF, etc.) and answers all questions of authentic Catholic Church teaching. If you have never read an encyclical, this is the one to start; if you have questions on Catholic Church teaching on life issues, this is the one. All encyclicals may be accessed for free at Vatican.org.


