

March 15, 2020 Third Sunday of Lent

Reading I: Exodus 17: 3-7

The lack of drinking water brings down on Moses the wrath of his people. After asking for His help, Moses obeys the Lord and strikes a rock with his staff. That in turn brings forth water aplenty and revives Moses' standing.

Reading II: Romans 5: 1-2, 5-8

Paul asserts that God's love is the blessed assurance of salvation for his brothers and sisters in the community. It is also his belief that "hope does not disappoint."

Gospel: John 4: 5-42

It was unheard of for a rabbi to speak in a familiar way with a woman in public, but even worse for a Jew to request water of a Samaritan. For Jesus, who does precisely both, He prefers to speak to the woman about "living water." By that He meant "divine vitality, revelation and wisdom."



- This weekend please take a bottle to fill and help change a life. St. Ignatius supports the Legacy of Life Foundation, which funds two crisis pregnancy centers, one located in Bristol and one in Philadelphia Pennsylvania serving over 500 families struggling to provide simple baby supplies for their children. In 2019, with your help and God's grace, over 350 women have been saved from the pain and scars of abortion at our centers!
- Many of the women who come through our doors believe they have no other choice but abortion. They may feel scared, alone, and totally overwhelmed, not sure what to do, and have no one to talk to. Our centers provide free services such as pregnancy testing, counseling, ultrasounds, and advocacy, as well as material and financial support for women so they can receive the truth about their choice and be freed from fear. But our support does not stop there! Our program goes on to empower women through advocacy and mentoring programs throughout their pregnancy, and for at least three years after their babies are born. Since we opened our doors 10 years ago, over 2500 women and babies were saved from the pain and scars of abortion. In 2017, 420 women chose life at our centers, 332 in 2018 and 350 chose life in 2019!! THANK YOU for your prayerful and generous support!

We meet every month on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:30 PM on the second floor of the Antioch center. We have been offering many types of programs for over 20 years. As a committee, including our own

members, many adults have not had any education or formation of their faith since leaving high school (if they attended a Catholic HS). Many are inundated with information, possibly to the contrary, and certainly to the secular world daily on news, TV, radio, and social media. We try to identify topics of current life, culture and interest and use various types of social media... live speakers, DVD's, and movies to teach, expound and stimulate conversation and faith sharing. One particularly successful program we have in the past year was on miracles and to the surprise of the over 30 people in attendance were pleased to hear of several personal miracles that had occurred to those in attendance.

Many of our topics have to do with morality and ethics and the pressing questions that confront each of us in daily life. Some of these questions deal with birth; some with suffering; some with death; some with 'what Is truth'?; some with relativism; some Bible study; some faith sharing; some on miracles, evil, suffering, evil possession, some with bible timelines and many, many others.

Join us at a meeting to help us pick topics for next year; join us at one of our programs. In fact, we have one more this 'season' on Sat. March 28 with a viewing of the "Unplanned: the Movie" on a factually based story of Abby Johnson and her experience with Planned Parenthood and her conversion. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.




"To celebrate the Gospel of life means to celebrate the God of life, the God who gives life... In every child which is born and in every person who lives or dies we see the image of God's glory. We celebrate this glory in every human being, a

sign of the living God, an icon of Jesus Christ" (The Gospel of Life 84). If we know anything from Bible history, biology, or even general knowledge in philosophy, human life begins at fertilization/conception; humans have intellect and free will differing them from all other created species; humans are created in the image and likeness of God. Biography of Fr. Pio Mandato

Pio Francesco Mandato, F.M.H.J., was born in Italy in 1956 to Graziella and Andre Mandato. His family lived in Pietrelcina, the same town where Padre Pio was born and raised. Pio Mandato's family and extended family, including his great-grandfather, received many graces through the years from their spiritual father, Padre Pio.

When Graziella's baby boy arrived on July 6, 1956, she was delighted that he shared not only Padre Pio's baptismal name, Francesco, but also his name in religion, Pio. Padre Pio sent his blessing as well as a medal with the Blessed Virgin on one side and St. Michael the Archangel on the other.

Pio Francesco Mandato was four years old when his grandfather, Paris, took him for the first time to see Padre Pio in his cell. Padre Pio blessed little Pio Francesco and embraced him. Little Pio came just up to the middle of Padre Pio's waist. Afterward, he told his mother, "Padre Pio has perfume on his tummy." Graziella told her son that Padre Pio did not wear perfume. The fragrance was a spiritual gift that the Lord had given him, one among many gifts. It was a sign of grace for those who perceived it.

Seven- year old Pio Francesco and his younger brother Vincent received their first Holy Communion from Padre Pio on October 3, 1964, on the feast of the Transitus of St. Francis of Assisi (the feast of the death of St. Francis of Assisi). Afterward Padre Pio said to the young boys, "I pray that your last Holy Communion will be even more beautiful than your first." Pio Francesco remembers the solemnity and the great devotion with which Padre Pio celebrated Mass. Although his Mass was long, the time seemed to pass very quickly.

Pio Francesco Mandato was ordained to the priesthood in Hoboken, New Jersey in 1985. He and his family made a trip to Italy so that he could celebrate his first Mass in Pietrelcina at the Madonna Della Libera altar (Our Lady of Liberty), at Our Lady of the Angels parish. It was the very same church and altar where Padre Pio had celebrated his first Mass on August 14, 1910.

Today, Father Pio Francesco Mandato, F.M.H.J., belongs to the Franciscan Missionary Hermits of St. Joseph and lives in Eastern Pennsylvania. He continues to live out his priestly vocation in the spirit of St. Francis of Assisi. He feels that Padre Pio is still guiding him and helping him on his spiritual journey. "More than anything else, I remember Padre Pio as a very loving man, like a loving father," Father Pio Francesco said.

The words that Padre Pio said to his mother so many years before remain a consolation to him, "Tell Graziella that I always have her present in my prayers and I am united to her whole family." Father Pio Francesco Mandato continues to carry on the work of the Lord.

"God is our place. . .It takes a lifetime to realize fully that God is our place, that God is truly enough, that God alone is all we need and alone can bring us the peace and meaning we long for in life."
