



The Archdiocese of Philadelphia announced that Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez has suspended all public Masses in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia effective at 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 18th and until further notice. Last week, the Archbishop dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Both decisions were made in response to the growing concern over the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the directives provided by government and health department officials at the local, state, and national levels. These measures will be re-evaluated pending future developments. Easter is in two weeks. It is not about bunnies and eggs and candy and easter gifts and baskets and, yet, while many are invested in those celebrations the real meaning is a celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus

from the dead to overcome death and renew our opportunity to access eternal life with Him in Heaven. All it takes is a 'yes' like Mary. He suffered one of the worst deaths (personal recommendation to watch Gibson's "The Passion of the Christ" with Caviezel) to show us how to 'die with dignity' and acceptance of His mission as per His heavenly Father's plan, and the reward of such acceptance and such 'yes' without complaint, without diversion, even at the moment of death in 'giving' us His mother to be our Mother. Even at the moment of the death of Dismis (the good thief) there is immediate reward at acceptance and request for forgiveness to be in Paradise. Jesus 'emptied' Himself both literally and physically and that example was to show us that we need to empty ourselves of our attachments to things of this world so we may be filled with the Holy Spirit and experience conversion of the 'hardness' of our hearts. Let us meditate on these mysteries over the next two weeks and prepare ourselves through fasting, abstinence and emptying ourselves, as well as learning from Jesus how to accept our suffering which can have salvific consequences for us just like the good thief.


St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

Respect "With great openness and courage, we need to question how widespread is the culture of life today among individual Christians, families, groups and communities in our Dioceses. With equal clarity and determination we must identify the steps we are called to take in order to serve life in all its truth" (The Gospel of Life 95). This encyclical was written by Pope St. JP II in 1985. We are now 35 years later; we have not progressed; while some report abortions to be decreased, there are no reporting mechanisms for medical abortions; for pregnancies lost to IUD's or the contraceptive pill or the morning after pill! We 'know not what we do'; what we are called to is to honor; to do so means relationship; if we all had a deep and loving relationship with Jesus and we 'knew' what it is that He calls us to – a 'gospel of life'- then this nation would be a nation of life, for life and we would all enjoy living in a culture of life. Unfortunately, that is NOT the case; we have a lot of work to do; it starts with knowing Jesus and having a relationship with Him and know His Word and what it is that He calls us to...everyday of our lives! In two weeks we will be remembering the Pascal Mystery-there is NO resurrection without crucifixion! Let us get to know Jesus; after Easter, we will celebrate His mercy. Amen.

Bishop Joseph F. Martino will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, May 2, 2020, at a 10:00 a.m. Mass. (We have not heard anything from the Bishop yet, but if we are rescheduled for Confirmation, it will be the Bishop's choice).

<u>VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL CAMP:</u> Our VBS program this year is Rocky Railway – Jesus' power pulls us through. Our school and PREP children have received registration brochures. The fee is \$50 per child, and the children receive a snack every day, a music CD, Bible Buddies, etc. This year, our Vacation Bible School Camp is scheduled for June 22 to June 26, 2020 for those children who will be entering Grades K to 5. We need some volunteers – adults and kids from age 12 and up – to help us out. Please consider volunteering. It is a great week!
