Pentecost

Reading I: Acts 2: 1-11

The exciting narrative shifts from a room in a "house" where tongues of fire appeared over Mary and the Apostles to an unidentified gathering place where people from many countries hear preaching in their own languages.

Reading II: I Corinthians 12: 3b-7, 12-13

The community learns that it is the Spirit who enables their belief in the lordship of Jesus. All gifts come from Him, and when the community works together for the spread of the Gospel, it functions just like the parts of the human body do.

The Gospel: John 20: 19-23

This section returns us to Easter evening, and the risen Jesus' appearance in His glorified body. Then He confers His peace on the Apostles; shows them His scars, and then gives them a commission.

Statement from the Archdiocese Regarding the Project Resumption of the Public Celebration of Mass in the Five-County Region

In mid-March, the celebration of public Mass was suspended in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and the obligation for the faithful to attend Mass was dispensed. Those decisions were not made lightly and were always intended to be temporary measures.

They were made out of necessity for the common good and in recognition of the fact that all of us share a responsibility for the preservation of public health, especially in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. During this unprecedented time, the Archdiocese has made every effort to provide for the spiritual needs of the faithful as well as the temporal needs of those who benefit from its many charitable works.

It is important to note that Catholic churches in the Archdiocese have never been closed. Local parish churches have remained open for private prayer as well as the celebration of the Sacraments Baptism, Penance, Matrimony, and funeral Masses at the discretion of the local pastor and with respect for guidelines from public health officials as they have evolved over time.

Based on recent statements from government officials at the state level, it is anticipated that the five-county region comprising the Archdiocese of Philadelphia will move into the "yellow" phase of the statewide re-opening plan by Friday, June 5th. As such, it is projected that the celebration of daily and Sunday Masses will resume beginning on Saturday, June 6th.

The administration of the Archdiocese has been working in consultation with public health officials to ensure that such a resumption takes place within the context of state approved guidelines and is actively working to provide appropriate guidance to its clergy so that all will be as prepared as possible when the public celebration of Mass begins again. All of us are eager to open the doors of Church wide for the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

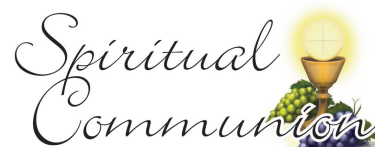

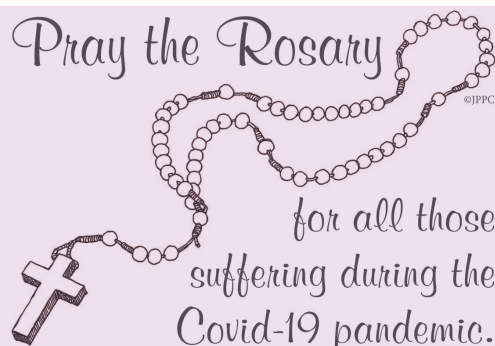

SACRAMENTS:

FIRST COMMUNION: First Communion Day has been rescheduled again to Saturday, September 12.

The 9:30 a.m. Mass is for St. Ignatius School and Wednesday PREP children. The 12:00 noon Mass is for Sunday and Monday PREP children. If this works out, there will be a rehearsal for the school and Wednesday PREP kids from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m., on Wednesday, Sept. 9. CONFIRMATION: The Archdiocese has cancelled all May and June Confirmations because of the Coronavirus. We will let you know as soon as possible when we hear the new date. 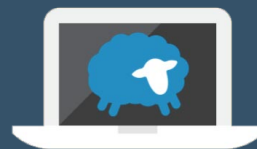

Helpful Resources

ECONOMIC RESOURCES:

Pennsylvania Unemployment Compensation: You may be eligible for unemployment if your employer has closed due to COVID-19, your hours have been reduced, you have been told not to work, or have been told to isolate or self-quarantine. Important to note, is that under the federal economic stimulus law, state unemployment benefits are increased by up to \$600/month for 4 months through July 31st, and unemployment is now available for up to 39 weeks. Self-employed, independent contractors and freelancers also may be eligible.

Direct Cash Payments: Under the federal economic stimulus law, you will receive a direct payment of \$1,200 if you earn \$75,000 or less, or \$2,400 if you and your spouse make up to \$150,000. Each dependent child increases the amount by an additional \$500. The amount decreases for individuals with incomes above \$75,000, and payments cut off for those above \$99,000. Payments are expected to be direct deposited by the end of April; but if mailed, receipt will take longer.

Emergency Small Business Loans: Small businesses (in operation before Feb. 15th, 2020, with paid employees) may be eligible for loans through the Paycheck Protection Program. A portion of the loan can be forgiven by the government if all employees are kept on the payroll for a minimum 8 weeks. There are many conditions, so for more information, please visit: <https://www.sba.gov/funding-programs/loans/paycheck-protection-program>

Federal and State Income Tax Filing Deadlines: Extended to July 15th

Federal Student Loans: You will not have to pay your federal student loans (loans held by the U.S. Department of Education) for 6 months through September 30th, and interest will not accrue. This provision does not apply to private student loans, so please check with your lender.

FOOD RESOURCES:

Food Stamps/SNAP Benefits: You may be eligible for food stamps (SNAP benefits) to help buy food and groceries, due to a job loss/loss of income from the coronavirus pandemic. However, there are income limits, based on family size-- the chart is on the right side of the link below. You can apply online: <https://www.dhs.pa.gov/Services/Assistance/Pages/SNAP.aspx>

Catholic Social Services/Mary's Cupboard: Offers food/groceries to those in need; only open Mondays and Fridays from 10 a.m.-Noon; Please call 215-945-2550 to make an appointment first.
