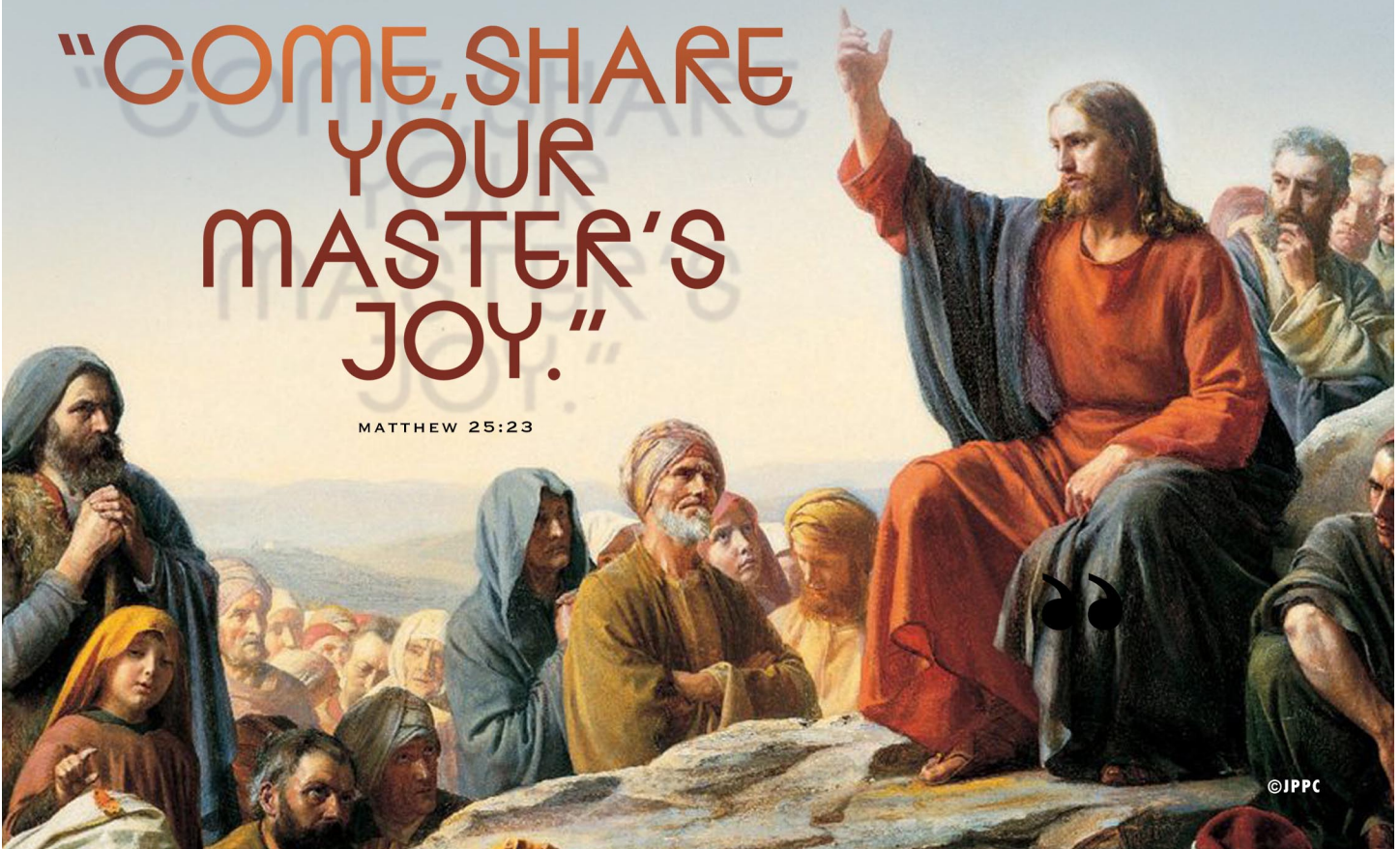

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Proverbs 3: 10-13, 19-20, 30-31

The portrait of the worthy wife completes the feminine imagery in the whole book. The wife described here is the practical everyday counterpart to the highly placed Lady Wisdom touted previously.

Reading II: I Thessalonians 5: 1-6

St. Paul is thinking in terms of the end times. He stresses how suddenly they will arrive, and how inevitably they will come. But being children of light, his intended readers are fully prepared.

The Gospel: Matthew 25: 14-30, or 25; 14-15, 19-21

Jesus' parable is one with several meanings, but ultimately it stresses both prudence and the importance of using one's gifts to serve others, especially the poor. On this World Day of the Poor, the latter meaning is most appropriate.

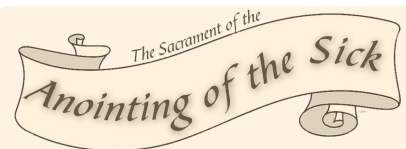
BAPTISM

FISCAL CORNER

As of week 6 of the Parish appeal, 213 families have contributed \$73,365.71 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 48.91% of this year's goal. We are now \$6,149 behind last year's pace. We ask that you please consider a gift towards this most important appeal!

This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. While our Sunday collections are consistent, we are facing a shortfall in the school due to Covid remediation. Additional cost for cleaning and sanitizing, additional staff for remediation, supplies and signage, as well as the reduction in enrollment in our PreK program will result in a larger than average parish subsidy. If you can help with this effort, it would be greatly appreciated! You should have received our appeal materials in the mail. 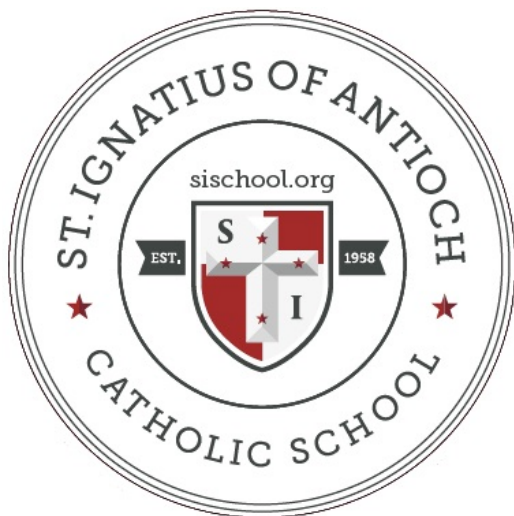

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

One of the things we can do for Advent is to celebrate the many liturgical feasts throughout the month of November. Dec. 3 is the feast of St. Francis Xavier- one of the founding members of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and led an extensive mission to proclaim Christianity throughout Asia. Dec. 6 is the feast of St. Nicholas- the 'original Santa Claus' who left candy in children's shoes; this is a good opportunity to tell the story to your children/grandchildren. Dec. 8 is the feast of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation commemorating the immaculate conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary- her being conceived without original sin. Dec. 9- the feast of St. Juan Diego who is the peasant to whom the Virgin Mary appeared as Our Lady of Guadalupe and responsible for ending the holocaust in Mexico. Dec. 12 is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe who on the morning of Dec. 9, 1531 appeared to Juan Diego and asked for a Church to be built on Tepeyac hill- she appeared as a young native woman on the tilma which survives to this day uncorrupted. Dec. 13 is the feast of St. Lucy- a young Christian martyr whose eyes were gouged out and led to the celebration of light and her being the patron saint of people with eye problems. Dec. 14 is the feast of St. John of the Cross- who together with St. Theresa of Avila reformed the Carmelite order and well-known for his spiritual writings which had an enormous impact on the development of the Catholic contemplative tradition. Dec. 16 is Las Posada- the 9 day celebration of its origins in Spain and a re-enactment of Joseph and Mary seeking lodging in Bethlehem. Dec. 16 is the beginning of the special Christmas novena. Dec. 17 is the celebration of the O antiphons which are sung during the last 7 days of Advent. Then, of course, Dec. 25- the birthday of Jesus and Dec. 28 the feast of the Holy Innocents. Let us celebrate, let us pray.

Respect



Assist all those who are trapped in a state of slavery; intercede with God on their behalf so that they will be released from their chains of captivity. ... Provide comfort to survivors of slavery and let them look to you as an example of hope and faith, we pray.

There are many types of slavery; most will immediately think of the historical type over which the Civil War was fought, but there is also slavery to sin and slavery through human trafficking and slave to disrespect for life. In the US, we may think that we have overcome slavery at a great price, but we are still enslaved. Look at our addictions; look at our mental health issues and suicides; look at the numbers of abortions; look at many, especially children, who are enslaved through human trafficking; look at pornography; look at alcoholism; look at our divorce rates and infidelity; look at our child abuse. We have been enslaved since the Garden of Eden. This column is about the respect of life. Imagine a world where that was the primary *modus operandi*! Imagine a world with peace, love of God, love of neighbor and respect for all, including all life from conception to natural death.

As we approach Thanksgiving during this pandemic, let us examine the meaning of our lives and what gifts God has given us and give thanks for all we have and ask ourselves what is the 'message' that perhaps God is sending us through this pandemic.
