September 13, 2020 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Sirach 27: 30 – 28: 7

This section of the Israelite Wisdom literature matches the Christian imperative. It certainly is our duty to forgive others, and not to hold grudges or to hate one's neighbor.

Reading II: Romans 14: 7-9

The liberating act of Christ, by way of which He freed us from bondage to sin and death, has enabled us to live for God. That is the basis of life in a Christian society.

The Gospel: Matthew 18: 21-35

This instructional parable, with its three "acts," teaches us first that God's patience is a gift to us, and also that we have an obligation to imitate God's mercy by our forgiving attitude.

FISCAL CORNER

On August 25th, auditors representing the Archdiocese of Philadelphia completed a remote audit of St. Ignatius of Antioch Parish. The auditors examined the records from both the school and the church. Aside from a couple of procedural issues, no major inconsistencies were found. Recommendations were made on the procedures for entering data in our Sunday collection online data system, minor employee record keeping updates and minor bookkeeping procedure changes.
