Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Ezekiel 33: 7-9

The prophet is tasked with becoming a watchman over Israel. He must warn the wicked to change their ways or else the consequences will be deadly. Not to urge them so, in a form of fraternal correction, would bring about the prophet's own death.

Reading II: Romans 13: 8-10

Paul teaches his readers that charity always has a role in Christian conduct. Nor is it to be limited to fellow Christians. Love is ultimately the complete fulfillment of the Mosaic law.

The Gospel: Matthew 18: 15-20

Matthew has Jesus speak in a way unlike anything else He has said, with references to matters like the Church, which did not yet exist. Still, the teaching about fraternal correction is timeless. Later comes the consoling words of His guarantee of presence in any gathering of two or more made in His name.

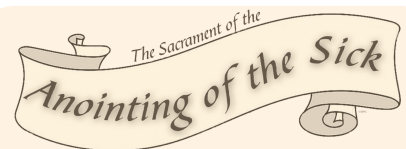

SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE APPEAL

Next weekend (September 12th-13th) the parish Social Action Committee will hold its quarterly collection when we reach out to you for your financial support.

The **Social Action Committee** has a long history of supporting those in need in our local community: we support Catholic Social Services by purchasing baby diapers, cribs and other baby items for mothers in need, and their food pantry, Mary's Cupboard. We also assist the Advocates for the Homeless and Those in Need (AHTN), an organization which helps the homeless in lower Bucks County—our volunteers provide a free Shared Meal in person each month to over 70 people, and during the pandemic have provided over 40 to-go meals monthly. We also support the Knights of Columbus' Legacy of Life program, assisting local women with newborn children and purchasing clothes for the Lady of Fatima Thrift Shop in Bensalem, benefitting low income families.

Closer to home, we have provided parish families with clothing, school uniforms, food, and utility expenses. We have provided travel expenses to a parish family experiencing medical problems with a child, and recently helped a parish family who experienced a house fire and were living in a hotel. To help support our annual Coat Drive, Turkey Drive, weekly food collections, "Stuff the Bus," and monthly Shared Meals for the homeless, we rely heavily on your financial contributions.

During the pandemic, members of our Social Action Committee and the Knights of Columbus established, and administer our parish **Community Emergency Fund**, created to help those in need in our local community due to the pandemic. Because of your generosity, we have been able to help close to 35 individuals and families with critical living expenses like food, prescription co-pays, medical expenses and baby items. In addition, we have been able to help hundreds more through our support of local non-profits like Neighbor in Need and Mary's Cupboard.

The Fund will continue to operate under the Social Action Committee- therefore we will continue to assist those in need due to the pandemic as well as continue to support all the other programs the Social Action Committee does right now. But to continue to do this work, we need your help!

Whether you choose to give directly to the Social Action Committee or to the Community Emergency Fund, we encourage and appreciate your donations. You can donate by using the special envelope designated for the Social Action Committee in the September 12-13th collection, mailing a check to the rectory, or donating online through the Parish Giving website.

PREP REGISTRATION:

PREP (Parish Religious Education Program) is for children in Grades K to 8. There is no increase in tuition this coming year. All PREP families have received the Registration Form by email. 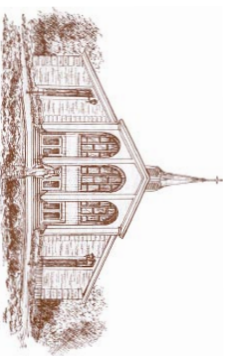
