### Easter Sunday The Resurrection of the Lord

#### **Reading I: Acts 10: 34a, 37-43**

Peter's sermon contains the heart of the Apostolic preaching message, with the added promise of forgiveness of sin for all believers.

#### **Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4**

The promises of the Messianic age are fulfilled in Jesus Christ. At the end of time, Christ and all the believers in Him will appear in glory.

#### **The Gospel: John 20: 1-9**

In John's gospel, written the last of the four, the full meaning of Easter is the completion of Jesus' return to His Father. Only then will the disciples "remember" and understand the meaning of these events. Meanwhile, "the Beloved Disciple" immediately believes in the resurrection, as opposed to the doubt of Thomas.
