



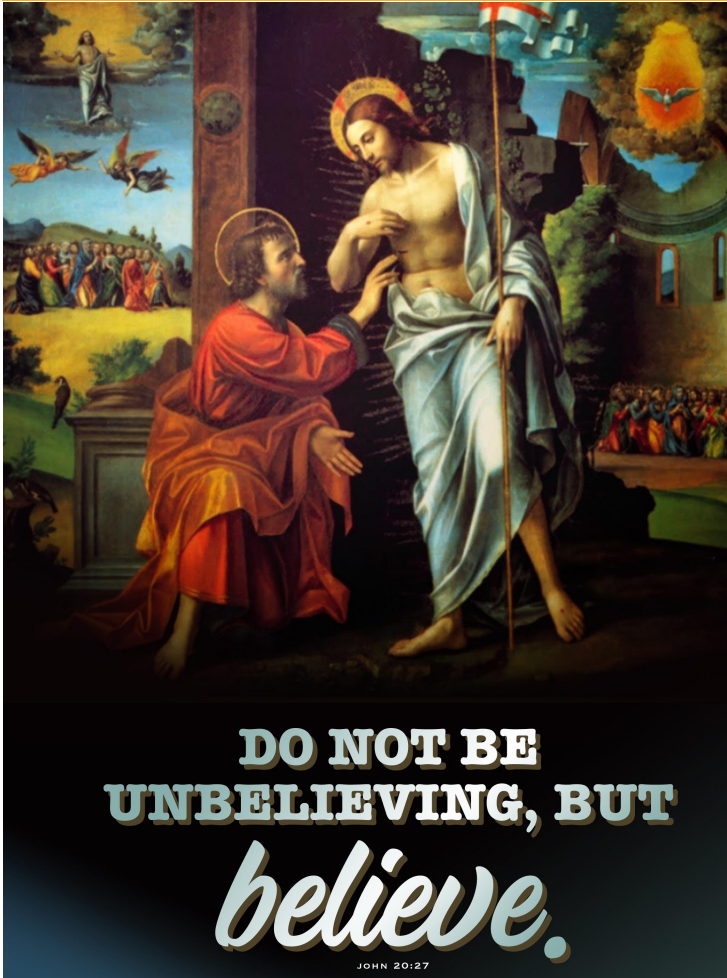

The Second Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts 4: 32-35

We read a description of the “golden age” of the early Church in Apostolic times. It is an ideal community life, in which members generously surrendered their goods and property based on their needs.

Reading II: I John 5: 1-6

This “letter” is really an exhortation to its readers to so live that their faith overcomes “the world.” God’s Son came to us “in water and blood.”

The Gospel: John 20: 19-31

After the report of St. Thomas’ initial doubt and its resolution, we learn the purpose of the Gospel: having faith in Jesus as Messiah and Son of God, who is the source of eternal life.

hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw
the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you.
As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had
said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive
the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them,
and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Di-
dymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus
came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the
Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the
nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks
and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a
week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his dis-
ciples that are not written in this book. But these are written
that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the
Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life
in his name.

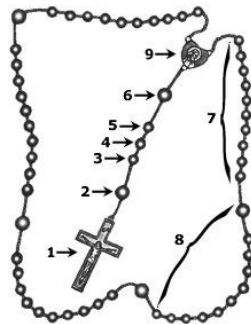
THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

How to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross**
In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- 2. Opening Prayers**
You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.
(Repeat three times)
O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You!
- 3. Our Father**
Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.
- 4. Hail Mary**
Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.
- 5. The Apostle's Creed**
I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
- 6. The Eternal Father**
Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade**
For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- 8. Repeat for the remaining decades**
Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father bead and then 10 "For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.
- 9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)**
Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- 10. Optional Closing Prayer**
Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion-inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to You holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

From the Religious Education Office ... The PREP office is open from Sundays through Thursdays. Annmarie is in the office during the day from Monday through Thursday and in the Antioch Center (old rectory) on Sundays and weekday evenings.

PREP REGISTRATION: PREP (Parish Religious Education Program) is for children in Grades K to 8. PREP classes are being held remotely at the present time. Parents can find the lessons on the parish website. (Go to www.stignatius.church, and then click on PREP. The grade levels will come up, so click on the level you want. Finish up by completing the Interactive Session Review and send results to Mrs. Perini's email – lperini@stignatius.church). Each class's lesson will be available for 3 weeks only. Then the next lesson will replace it. Registered families can communicate with the teachers by email. If you want to register your child(ren), please stop in our office or call us (215-493-5204) to receive the registration form by email.

Special Needs: Parents, are you aware that we have a PREP class for students with special needs? If we could help to give your child a religious education in a small group environment, please call Annmarie at 215-493-5204.

8th Grade Students: We do have an 8th grade program for those students who have already received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Parents, please register your 8th grade students so they can continue to learn about God and his Church.

PREP TEACHERS NEEDED: We do need PREP teachers for the 2021 – 2022 school year. If you need to find out more information or you already know you want to volunteer, please call Annmarie at 215-493-5204 or 215-370-5701. Please don't assume that you can't teach. Most of our PREP teachers thought the same thing, and they are fantastic!

FIRST COMMUNION: Please send in the \$25 Sacrament Fee as soon as possible. First Communion is scheduled for Saturday, April 17, 2021, at the 9:30 a.m. Mass and the 12:00 noon Mass. Rehearsal will be in Church from 6:00 to 7:15 p.m. on Monday, April 12 for the 9:30 a.m. Mass and the same time, same place on Wednesday, April 14 for the 12:00 noon Mass.

CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, April 24, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. Mass and 1:30 p.m. Mass, with Bishop John J. McIntyre. You will be receiving an email about rehearsal for Confirmation as we get closer to that date. Don't forget to contribute to the Bishop's choice of charity (St. John's Hospice – a shelter for homeless men).

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter which concludes the Octave of Easter. The feast day is observed by the Roman Catholic Church as well as some Anglicans. It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that St. Faustina Kowalska reported as part of her encounters with Jesus and is associated with special promises from Jesus and indulgences issued by the Church.

According to the diary of St. Faustina, the feast of Divine Mercy receives from Jesus the biggest promises of grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy, in particular that a person who goes to sacramental confession, receives Holy Communion and prays for the intentions of our Holy Father will receive total expiation of all sins and punishment- a plenary indulgence. That means that each person so receiving would go immediately after death to heaven without suffering in purgatory!!!!!! On April 30, 2000 St. Faustina Kowalska was canonized by Pope St. JP II and Pope JP II designated this day as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Jesus said to St. Faustina one day: "Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy". This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity. Join us this afternoon at 3 PM, the hour of Divine Mercy to offer prayer and celebrated the Chaplet. Go to confession; receive communion and pray for the intentions of our Holy Father; receive the indulgence.

"Those who die in God's grace and friendship live forever with Christ. Heaven is not an abstract idea, but a true and lasting relationship with God that is beyond all earthly description and understanding. We look forward to the resurrection of the dead and everlasting life by preparing now, in hope, for our passage from this life into eternal life." Today is Divine

Mercy Sunday. Each year, on the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th century, when civilization again began to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would also henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. As seen, the need for this Mercy was the loss of understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life, all of which is created in His image and likeness. When we see another person, we are looking at Christ; when we kill another person, a baby, we are killing Christ all over again. Let us stop the carnage. Let us ask for His mercy and forgiveness as we 'know not what we do'!
