



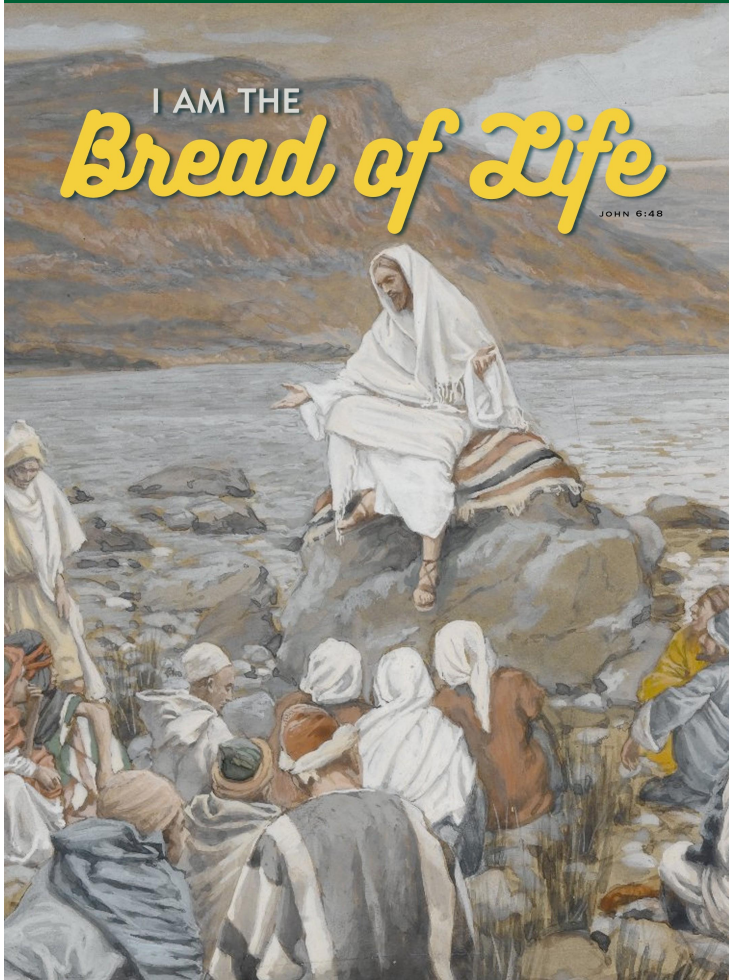

Reacting to the people's complaint, Yahweh provides prompt relief by sending the manna and the quail. The manna, for St. John, is a "type" of the Holy Eucharist.

Reading II: Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24

The "old man" for Paul represents the convert's life led only with mere human resources to go by leading to weakness and sin. The new life, "put on" at Baptism is an actual incorporation into Christ.

The Gospel: John 6: 24-35

Jesus instructs the crowd that has followed Him on the nature of the true bread from heaven, which is Christ Himself. This Bread alone gives a person true life.

St. Ignatius will continue to stream our 9:30am Mass live through Sunday August 8th.

From the Religious Education Office ... The PREP office is open from Sundays through Thursdays during the school year. During the month of July, my schedule is different, but I am still available. PREP REGISTRATION: PREP Registration Forms are available at the PREP office (from Monday through Thursday) or the Rectory during business hours. You can also download it from the parish website under PREP. PREP classes will be in person this year – not remote. There are 3 sessions available – Sunday from 10:35 to 11:50 a.m., Monday from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m., and the week of August 9 (9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon) with 1 Wednesday evening a month starting in September. Most grades in the August session are already full. Fall classes begin on September 12 and 13. A note to Parents of children going into Grade 1: No child in PREP can go to grade 2 without completing grade 1. If your child did not attend PREP in first grade, talk to me and we can come up with a plan.

Special Needs: Parents, are you aware that we have a PREP class for students with special needs? If we could help to give your child a religious education in a small group environment, please call Annmarie at 215-493-5204.

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

Next month we will resume our in-person, live presentations of our programs for the upcoming Fall/Winter series. It has been a long time coming. Yes, we were able to do some ZOOM programs last year and they were well attended and appreciated by those who tuned in, but the fellowship that is part of our programs is an important aspect and benefit to our church community. Our men's program will begin on 9/22/2021 and will be in the Antioch center, second floor with a DVD presentation followed by small breakout groups for discussion. Our topic will be 1 Corinthians and the program will run for 10 weeks, every Wednesday evening from 7-8:30 PM. Light refreshments will be offered. Walking with Purpose will also be revived beginning on Tuesday Sept. 28 meeting in the church auditorium as usual from 9:30 to 11:15 AM, while the evening program will move to the Antioch center and be on Tuesday evenings from 6:45 to 8:30 PM. Babysitting will be available for the morning programs and these sessions usually run for 25 weeks well into the Spring. This will be the 13th year for WWP (not counting the 'pandemic year') and usually 100 or so women attend. Plan on joining us as we attempt to revive our programs and enrich our faith lives with study, faith sharing and community. As Pope St. JP II had stated in the beginning of his papacy, 'be not afraid' and that refrain is echoed in one of the more favorite hymns of many, 'be not afraid, I go before you always, come follow me, and I will give you rest'. So, come follow He who is calling you.

"We thank you, heroic mothers, for your invincible love! We thank you for your intrepid trust in God and in his love. We thank you for the sacrifice of your life" (EV 86). Evangelium Vitae (EV) is an encyclical authored by Pope St. JP II in 1995 on the feast of the incarnation of Mary, Mother of God. It is translated as "The Gospel of Life" and deals with issues pertaining to the sanctity of human life, including murder, abortion, euthanasia and capital punishment, reaffirming the Church's stances on said issues in a way generally considered consistent with previous Church teachings. A portion of it states that 'man is called to a fullness of life which far exceeds dimensions of his earthly existence, because it consists in sharing the very life of God'! The encyclical also addresses social and ecological factors, stressing the importance of a society which is built around the family rather than a wish to improve efficiency, and emphasizing the duty to care for the poor and the sick. Let us pray to Mary in this month honoring her Assumption into heaven for life, the dignity of the person, both born and unborn, and our families as they are being attacked every day.
