

## Reading I: Revelation 11: 19A; 12: 1-6a, 10ab

The opening of the Temple expresses an extraordinary self-revelation of God. The woman in this vision our Church takes to be the Virgin Mary. She boldly faces the red dragon, the symbol of chaos. Salvation comes through Christ her Son.

# Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 20-27

Paul offers a thesis: at the end of time when everyone ever created will rise from the dead, along with "those who belong to Christ." We know and believe that Our Lady belonged to Christ.

## The Gospel: Luke 1: 39-56

Elizabeth and Mary pronounce the meaning of Jesus in God's plan of salvation. Mary offers her great prayer of praise, the "Magnificat." Her prayer is an integral part of the Liturgy of the Hours as Evening Prayer.

PREP REGISTRATION: PREP Registration Forms are available at the PREP office (from Monday through Thursday) or the Rectory during business hours. You can also download it from the parish website under PREP. PREP classes will be in person this year – not remote. There are 3 sessions available – Sunday from 10:35 to 11:50 a.m., Monday from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m., and the week of August 9 (9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon) with 1 Wednesday evening a month starting in September from 6:30 to 7:50 p.m. Obviously, only Sunday and Monday classes are available now.

Sunday PREP Classes begin on September 12 (10:35 to 11:50 a.m.), and Monday classes begin on September 13 (6:30 to 7:45 p.m.).

A note to Parents of children going into Grade 1: No child in PREP can go to grade 2 without completing grade 1. If your child did not attend PREP in first grade, talk to me and we can come up with a plan.

"In times of suffering, the human person should be able to experience a solidarity and a love that takes on the suffering, offering a sense of life that extends beyond death... In the family a person can count on strong relationships, valued in themselves apart from their helpfulness or the joy they bring. It is essential that the sick under care do not feel themselves

to be a burden, but can sense the intimacy and support of their loved ones" (SB 4-5). Let us reflect on how Mary supported Jesus in His ministry, suffering, death and Resurrection. She is the epitome of love and acceptance of suffering. Today we honor her Assumption into her Heavenly Queenship as Mother of God and Queen of Angels and Mother of our Church here on earth. Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ'" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, In Luc., 10, 121:PL 15 1834A.).

# **The Assumption of Mary**

Anyone searching for a grand, old, glorious name, needs to look no further than to "Mary". The various languages may see it as Marie, or Maria, or Mara, but throughout the world it is recognized and respected as the name of the mother of God.

Mary has been titled throughout history as a Queen, as Our Lady, and as Mary with special gifts. First we honor her as our Queen with titles that make some human titles seem provincial and pointless. Her Son, Jesus, allows us to call her":

Queen of Peace ----- Queen of the Universe ----- Queen of Heaven-----

Queen of the Angels ---- Queen of Mercy ----- Queen of the Sea

Consider the names chosen by her followers who adopt her as our mother and plead for her gifts to us:

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Our Lady of Sorrows Our Lady of Peace
Our Lady of Mercy Our Lady of Grace Our Lady of the Rosary
Our Lady of Consolation Our Lady of Confidence Our Lady of the Rocks
Whole cities have chosen to honor her and the messages delivered from their towns;

Our Lady of Guadalupe Our Lady of Lourdes Our Lady of Fatima.

We recognize Mary's greatest virtues with appositives added to her name showing what God ordained for the young Jewish maiden selected to be His mother:

Mary, Virgin and Mother Mary, Mother of Jesus Mary, Gentle Mother Mary, Most merciful Mary, Immaculate Mary, Most holy

Mary, Cause of our joy Mary, Lily among thorns Mary, Rose ever blooming

# Mary, Mother of wisdom, please urge our younger parish men to join the K of C.

To "assume" something means that many facts considered make it easy for us to conclude that a reasonable event will follow without needing additional proof. For example, we might assume confidently that daybreak will appear in the East tomorrow morning as it has every day we've checked. Consequently, we assume that Jesus would not allow his immaculate virgin Mother to be corrupted by death. Rather, we assume that He took her body and soul to heaven to reign as Queen over all of humanity without waiting for the general resurrection when our bodies and souls will be joined again on the last day. That is why Pope Pius X11 in 1950 proclaimed the feast of the Assumption of the body of Mary (Aug.15), a holy day of obligation and an official doctrine of faith in the Church.

Have any of you been told that Mary offers a healthy cure on August 15 for her followers who venture to the waters (ocean, lake, rivers, etc.) on that day? If you have not, ask any older Italian to explain "**FERRAGOSTO**". It refers to the fifteenth of August when all of Italy closes off businesses and everyone takes it as a holiday to go to the beach. Ask why they do so. Mary's promises still live in the hearts of many..
