

Reading I: Joshua 24: 1-2a, 15-17, 18b The prophet confronts the 12 tribes with the question: will you keep your covenant with Yahweh or not? They agree to stay united in a bond with Yahweh rather than desert Him.

**Reading II: Ephesians 5: 21-32a, or 5:2a, 25-32** Paul first presents a code of conduct for a Christian household that includes a hierarchical order from husband on down. Then he presents the notion of Christ's identity with His Church to which He gave His all.


ROSARY


All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00 Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.
