

Reading I: Deuteronomy 4: 1-2, 6-8

Observance of the law is an essential condition for the secure possession of the land for God's chosen people. It constitutes their true wisdom. Their God is always near to them.

Reading II: James 1: 17-18, 21b-22, 27

We are to welcome God's word into our hearts. For certain, true religion demands that we do good deeds and not just be passive listeners.

The Gospel: Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Pharisees act as if they are very concerned with observance of their laws about ritual purity, and Jesus' disciples appear negligent. Jesus warns them about substituting human teaching for divine commands, and using the law to escape from one's obligations.

There are 3 sessions available – Sunday from 10:35 to 11:50 a.m., Monday from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m., and the summer week program (has already been completed) with 1 Wednesday evening a month starting in September from 6:30 to 7:50 p.m. Obviously, only Sunday and Monday classes are available now.

Sunday PREP Classes begin on September 12 (10:35 to 11:50 a.m.), and Monday classes begin on September 13 (6:30 to 7:45 p.m.).

A note to Parents of children going into Grade 1: No child in PREP can go to grade 2 without completing grade 1. If your child did not attend PREP in first grade, talk to me and we can come up with a plan.
