

February 14, 2021 The Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46

The disease specified as leprosy was in ancient days any rash or scab seen as a contagious skin disease. Only the priest could determine whether or not its victim was worthy of temple worship. Once purified, the victim could reenter the community and worship with it.

Reading II: I Corinthians 10: 31-11:1

The community has the task of evangelization and must make conversion attractive, all the time avoiding obstacles to a prospect's decision. We are called to imitate Christ in our mission of outreach to others not Catholic.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 40-45

Jesus shows remarkable tenderness and compassion in curing the leper. He demands that the cured man obey the community law and go show himself to the priest.

ADULT FORMATION

Today is St. Valentine's day. By some accounts, St. Valentine was a Roman priest and physician who suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Christians by the emperor Claudius II

Gothicus about 270. He was buried on the Via Flaminia and Pope Julius I reportedly built a basilica over his grave. Other narratives identify him as the bishop of Terni, Italy, who was martyred, apparently also in Rome, and whose relics were later taken to Terni. It is possible these are different versions of the same original account and refer to only one person. According to legend St. Valentine signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and healed from blindness. Another common legend states that he defied the emperor's orders and secretly married couples to spare the husbands from war. A Martyr, one who voluntarily suffers death rather than deny his religion by words or deeds; such action is afforded special, institutionalized recognition in most major religions of the world. The term may also refer to anyone who sacrifices his life or something of great value for the sake of principle. So, the real question is this: is there anyone you love so much for whom you would suffer death? Your spouse? Your children? A friend? Your God? Your faith? Today, we should reflect on Ash Wednesday of this week and since we enter the season of contemplation on Jesus' sacrificial death out of love for us, we should fall so much in love with Jesus that we would be willing to do the same! Happy World Marriage Day to all married couples. May the love of Christ be with your marriages.

In helping the hungry, the thirsty, the foreigner, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned—as well as the child in the womb and the old person who is suffering or near death—we have the opportunity to serve Jesus." (Pope Saint John Paul II, Evangelium vitae, 87.). Today is Valentine's Day, a traditional secular holiday celebrating love. As Jesus tells us the two great commandments are to love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Do we think for one moment that some of the strife and division we currently see in our world is a result of loving our neighbors?

Have you ever read an encyclical? Do you know what an encyclical is? An encyclical is a papal letter sent to all bishops of the Roman Catholic Church. It is the highest form of communication by the Pope and usually deals with some aspect of Catholic teaching- clarifying, amplifying, condemning or promoting one or a number of issues. Evangelium Vitae (Gospel of Life) was promulgated March 25, 1995 and is a reflection and explanation of many topics regarding life. The Gospel of Life is at the heart of Jesus' message, and Pope St. JP II writes of the 'incomparable worth of the human person', ALL persons. We may not 'find' some people 'worth' loving, but we are called to hate the sin and love the sinner. So, on this day celebrating love, don't just love those that are 'easy' to love, do something for someone who is 'difficult' to love and you will be 'serving Jesus'! 
