

January 24, 2021 The Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Jonah 3: 1-5, 10

The prophet, as God's spokesman, brings about a miraculous turnaround by the people of Nineveh. Prior to that, the city was known only for its sinful cruelty and wickedness.

Reading II: I Corinthians 7: 29-31

St. Paul believed in an imminent end of the world, so he recommends detachment from earthly ways. It would be ridiculous to maintain one's "status quo" in such circumstances.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 14-20 Jesus calls His first disciples. He was so compelling that they were immediate with their responses. Jesus describes their new life's work as their becoming "fishers of men."

First Reading Jon 3:1-5, 10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah, saying:
"Set out for the great city of Nineveh,
and announce to it the message that I will tell you."
So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh,

BAPTISM



The Sacrament of Baptism is normally administered on Sundays at 12:45PM. Pre-Jordan class, for the first child only, is required for parents. Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance. Please call the rectory to make an appointment with one of the priests.



Exposition will be held Monday thru Friday from 10AM to 8PM. The restrictions for church attendance such as social distancing and wearing of masks apply. To assist with church sanitizing we are designating the front 3 pews for this devotion. We hope to resume 24/7 Perpetual Adoration in the Chapel when it is advisable. FISCAL CORNER

As of week 16, with only 1 week left of the Parish appeal, 339 families have contributed \$136,090.71 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 90.73% of this year's goal and are \$4,149 behind last year's pace. We ask that you please consider a gift towards this most important appeal!

This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. We are seeing a small decrease in our total Sunday collections as well as facing a shortfall in the school due to Covid remediation. Additional cost for cleaning and sanitizing, additional staff for remediation, supplies and signage, as well as the reduction in enrollment in our PreK program will result in a larger than average parish subsidy. If you can help with this effort, it would be greatly appreciated! You should have received our appeal materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church. This is Sanctity of Life Sunday. Every year our 8th grade students are challenged to write a prolife paper with cash prizes for the top three. This year's topic was

on "Why is abortion intrinsically evil"? Could you answer that question? There are only a few things that the Catholic Church designates as intrinsically evil, i.e. certain kinds of human acts that can never be morally justified or permitted, regardless of the intention of the person who performs them or any circumstances within which they take place. The evil is built-in or essential or inherent to that act. There are usually 5 that are mentioned in Catholic Church teaching: abortion, euthanasia, fetal stem cell research, same sex acts/marriage, and cloning of humans. These are always evil, always a sin, never acceptable and nonnegotiable. We all have a need to know our faith, what it teaches, why it teaches what it teaches and basically stay abreast of Church teaching. We have presented several programs on moral relativism and there is a very good video on same from Chris Stefanick. This is the recent cultural thought process whereby people 'relativize' behavior by selecting certain situations in which normally 'bad' behavior may become acceptable, like wrong for everyone generally but OK for a family member! Let us all pray a rosary a day for life and attend our programs.

ROSARY

All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00 Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.

Respect "Many people know someone personally who is suffering because of an abortion. If a friend confided in you tomorrow that she had an abortion, would you be able to respond in a way that brings her closer to healing? ... Even a woman who doesn't go to church or think of herself as religious can be afraid that God will never forgive her for having an abortion. She should know that God loves and forgives those who are sorrowful. He wants to comfort them and give them his peace." Many women who have had abortions, regardless of reason, suffer from PTSD. They never really resolve the issues surrounding their decisions and science has proven that women who have been pregnant have residing in their bodies fetal cells that had crossed the placenta from their pregnancies, so, some DNA remnants of aborted children are circulating in their mother's bloodstreams. Many psychological issues surface later in life. Rachel's Vineyard and Project Rachel provide support and accompaniment to these women and men to help them overcome. The March for Life will be next Friday, Jan. 29 and will be somewhat mitigated due to the pandemic. Our parish will not be having a bus to go to DC. However, Archbishop Perez will be streaming a mass from the Basilica on Friday morning. Pray a rosary daily for life.
