

Reading I: Amos 7: 12-15

Amaziah banishes Amos from Israel to Judah, where he is to carry out his unexpected calling. Amos avows that he is not one of the so-called "prophets for hire," but instead has a calling to preach from Yahweh.

Reading II: Ephesians 1: 3-14, or 1: 3-10

St. Paul blesses God the Father for calling upon him with a spirit of adoption as added motivation. Paul asserts that it is by our baptism that we are incorporated to the death and resurrection of Christ and also been redeemed

The Gospel: Mark 6: 7-13

St. Mark presents Jesus' commissioning of the apostles as a matter of extending His own ministry of teaching and healing. Material comfort is not a component of the work, nor is over confidence. Trust in God is paramount for the great work of their calling.

FORMATION

We are now 15 months into the 'great restriction' as I like to call it with lock down guidelines decreasing every day; it is the 27th Sunday of 2021 and the 21st day of summer. How
are we? Perspective is what is needed in these times; think about restrictions during WW
I, WW II, Spanish Flu, Great Depression, polio epidemic, flu epidemics, Korean War, two
Presidential assassinations, Viet Nam war, Gulf war, 911, Swine flu, economic meltdowns, sexual revolution,
feminism, etc., etc., etc. This too shall pass. Of course, many have died, but reflect that none have died that
would not have died in God's plan of life and love and our gradual departures from this world. Whether they
would have died from COVID or other means is not relevant, but what is relevant is the question that each of
us must ask- why is this happening now? Is God sending us a message? Are we in need of a correction?
What is it about our own lives, not others, that needs adjustment? Faith? Family? Finance? Health? Friends?
Society? All of the previous? Others? Sacraments? Our programs lend guidance and background on reflections
on these topics and many others. Consider joining us; in the meantime, read the Book of James in a Catholic
bible.

"Adopting Andrew has made us more aware of God's power and of his love for us. We realize that He always has a perfect plan for our lives." While many people take having children for granted, our Catechism of the Catholic Church and Humanae Vitae state that no one has a 'right' to a child, as if a child were a possession. Children are the supreme gift of a marriage between a man and a woman. This latter point is the basis of Catholic church teaching on abortion/contraception/Assisted reproductive technology. Crisis pregnancy centers offer other options to abortions, one of which are adoptions. Jesus was an adopted child to St. Joseph. In Him was manifested both biological and adopted! God has a Divine plan for ALL of His children which He wills to be created, regardless of circumstance. When children are aborted, we have NO idea what they would have become later in lifepriests? Doctors? Lawyers? Plumbers? Leaders? Artists? Architects? Discoverers of cures? Peacemakers? Jesus' words from the Cross are fitting- 'forgive them Father, they know not what they do'! We need to think deeply about what we do, and do what is right! Know the Truth- who is a Person.




GROTTO NEWS
