

Reading I: Exodus 24: 3-8

Moses, as leader, ratifies the Covenant between God and the people. The blood of the animal is splashed on both the altar and the people as the sign of this union.

Reading II: Hebrews 9: 11-15

Just as the Hebrew high priest had the right of access to the Holy of Holies because he bore the blood of the sacrificial animals with him, so Jesus the High Priest of the New Covenant, by the shedding of His Blood has access to the heavenly sanctuary.

The Gospel: Mark 14: 12-16, 22-26

Jesus had pre-arranged the room in the upper story of a house in Jerusalem. Mark connects the bread and wine at the meal with Jesus' imminent death.

COVID 19 Guidelines Update

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) issued new guidance on the use of face coverings and masks on Thursday, May 13, 2021. People who are fully vaccinated against the virus no longer need to wear masks or follow social-distancing guidelines in most indoor and outdoor settings, except as required by state and local laws or other regulations, according to the guidance.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania automatically adopted the relaxed measures on Thursday May 13th.

Therefore, churches and institutions of the Archdiocese in Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery Counties can freely comply with the relaxed measures with regard to face coverings/masks for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. People no longer need to wear face coverings/masks in church nor follow any social distancing if fully vaccinated.

The May 13, 2021 guidance does not apply to capacity regulations currently in place. Every other pew must be roped off in Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery Counties until Memorial Day, May 31, 2021.



Exposition will resume Monday thru Friday from 10AM to 8PM on June 14th. The restrictions for church attendance such as social distancing and wearing of masks apply. To assist with church sanitizing we are designating the front 3 pews for this devotion. We hope to resume 24/7 Perpetual Adoration in the Chapel when it is advisable. In the meantime, let us pray for each other and may God continue to bless you and your families. For information on chapel closings/openings, please call 215-550-5638 and listen to the message.

Wednesday, June 30 at 7 PM A Common Good Worth Living For: A Lecture by Archbishop Charles Chaput

Charles J. Chaput, Archbishop Emeritus of Philadelphia, reflects on the common good as the highest good in light of his recent book Things Worth Dying For: Thoughts on a Life Worth Living. In this book, he "examines the chronic questions of the human heart; the idols and false flags we create; and the nature of a life of authentic faith. He points to our longing to live and die with meaning as the key to our search for God, our loyalty to nation and kin, our conduct in war, and our service to others" In this evening lecture, the Archbishop deepens his description of things that are worth dying for by describing the centrality of the common good for a life worth living. Recentering our life on the common good beyond our private desires is ultimately the only path forward for us as persons in community.




GROTTO NEWS

- All are welcome to drop off electronic waste between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM. Follow the signs at any entrance.
- Items accepted with no charge: small appliances, computers, printers, small office electronics, cellular phones, cable & wiring, copiers, scanners, projectors, speakers, cameras, keyboards, modems, routers, laptops, radios, electronic toys, gaming devices, stereos, tablets, CD players, VCR's, computer equipment. (Note: All data on hard drives will be destroyed.)
- The following items include a cost to ensure they are properly recycled:

Microwave (\$10), Flat-screen Television (\$20), Air-conditioner (\$20), Dehumidifier (\$20), Air purifier (\$20), Computer monitor (\$5), Older CRT monitors and TVs: \$35-\$75 each (size varies).

Cash or personal check written out to "PAR-Recycle Works" is accepted.

- Please place donated items in the trunk or back seat of your vehicle before arriving at the SJE drop-off location. Please wear a mask in your vehicle when dropping off items. Pull up to one of the next volunteers who can assist you. STAY IN YOUR VEHICLE. Pop your trunk and/or unlock your back door. Please let the volunteer remove the donated item(s) from your back seat and/or trunk.
- Volunteers will be wearing masks and gloves, and they will be socially-distancing from you.
