THE PARABLE OF THE

MUSTARD SEED



Reading I: Ezekiel 17: 22-24

The prophet uses imagery of cedar trees to make his point. The “new twig” from the top of the cedar represents a future king from the House of David. The other cedars represent the kings of other nations.

Reading II: II Corinthians 5: 6-10

When we walk through life in faith, we are given needed courage, and our lives bear fruit. Thus do we become prepared for a favorable judgment by God.

The Gospel: Mark 4: 26-34

The metaphors in Our Lord’s parables allowed Him to speak about God and His kingdom in a way that got His hearers’ attention in ways other teaching techniques could not.

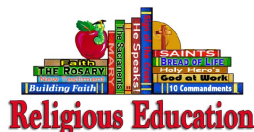

PREP REGISTRATION: PREP Registration Forms have been emailed to all families. If, for some reason, you didn't get it, please let me know. Our classes will be in person – not remote. Based on email feedback from our PREP families, there will be 3 sessions – Sunday from 10:35 to 11:50 a.m., Monday from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m., and the week of August 9 (9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon) with 1 Wednesday evening a month starting in September. If you need to pick up a registration form, please stop in the PREP Office from Monday through Thursday. Early Discounted Registration Period ends on June 30.

The Children's Liturgy of the Word has resumed with safety measures in place. All participants will be asked to wear masks/face shields. The children will be spaced six feet apart while we process downstairs at the start of Children's Liturgy and again while we process upstairs afterwards. In addition, we will set up the worship space on the floor of the auditorium to provide additional room to spread the children. The children will sit on individual mats that will be disinfected each week. Siblings will be permitted to sit next to one another, if they choose, but all other participants will be spaced six feet apart. For the time being, leaflets will not be distributed. ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

This past Friday, June 11, we celebrated the solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Sacred Body of Christ. Traditionally celebrated on the second Thursday after Whit Sunday (actually Pentecost Sunday, but Whit in Britain and Ireland), Corpus Christi is a Catholic holiday that celebrates the presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the Eucharist. Recent polls state that up to 70% or ‘proclaimed Catholics’ do not believe in the true presence in the Eucharist! This holy day has been celebrated since 1246 when Bishop of Liege, Bishop Robert de Torote was persuaded by St. Juliana to initiate a feast because of a vision she had received. Pope Urban VI ordered the whole Church to celebrate the feast in 1261. There is usually a procession led by carrying of the Monstrance containing the Eucharist through towns and neighborhoods. The Pew Research center estimates that just 31% of ‘proclaimed’ Catholics believe in transubstantiation where the substances of bread and wine are ‘transubstantiated’ into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Most believe that they are just ‘symbols’ of Christ and many don’t know what the Church teaches. Think about one item for a moment... if one TRULY believed that the bread and wine became the Body/Blood/Soul/Divinity of Christ – would you ‘show up’? how would you dress? How would you act? How would you speak? What would be different? Would you receive the Eucharist if you were not ‘worthy’ (i.e. in a state of mortal sin)? Confessions at St. Ignatius are every Saturday afternoon at 4 PM; lines are usually VERY short! Come visit Jesus.

Life Our relationship with Christ—strengthened by receiving him worthily in Holy Communion—helps us understand our relationships with one another and with creation. Perhaps now we understand why many of us were so upset over not being able to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. If we had a strong relationship with Jesus, we understand why we were ‘pining’ for His communion in our lives; for those not, perhaps now a stronger relationship. Perhaps, absence DOES make the ‘heart grow fonder’. Perhaps, we took ‘for granted’ that gift and in its absence realized what we were missing. Perhaps the pandemic, all politics aside, had a much deeper meaning that is a little different for each of us as our ‘sufferings’ were all different whether they were spiritual, physical, economic or relational (family deprivation). Let us ponder on the meaning of life; the gifts of life; the gifts of ‘inalienable rights’ within our Constitution, i.e. life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; freedom of religion! Gifts given by God bestowed on His children all because we are all created in His image and likeness. Quite often we don’t realize what we have until we lose it.
