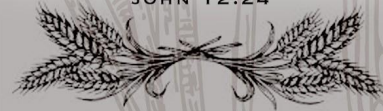

The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Reading I: Jeremiah 31: 31-34

These four verses have been described by scholars as “one of the profoundest and most moving in the entire Bible.” It marks the only time in the Old Testament when the words “new covenant” are used.

Reading II: Hebrews 5: 7-9

Jesus’ call from God makes Him uniquely qualified as one who can sympathize with sinners. His obedience elevated the value of His death.

The Gospel: John 12: 20-33

The Gentile Greeks come seeking Jesus, thus opening a new dimension of evangelization past the Jews and Samaritans. The well-known parable about a grain of wheat Jesus uses to comment on His pending death.

From the Religious Education Office ... The PREP office is open from Sundays through Thursdays. Annmarie is in the office during the day from Monday through Thursday and in the Antioch Center (old rectory) on Sundays and weekday evenings.

PREP REGISTRATION: PREP (Parish Religious Education Program) is for children in Grades K to 8. PREP classes are being held remotely at the present time. Parents can find the lessons on the parish website. (Go to www.stignatius.church, and then click on PREP. The grade levels will come up, so click on the level you want. Finish up by completing the Interactive Session Review and send results to Mrs. Perini's email – lperini@stignatius.church). Each class's lesson will be available for 3 weeks only. Then the next lesson will replace it. Registered families can communicate with the teachers by email. If you want to register your child(ren), please stop in our office or call us (215-493-5204) to receive the registration form by email.

Special Needs: Parents, are you aware that we have a PREP class for students with special needs? If we could help to give your child a religious education in a small group environment, please call Annmarie at 215-493-5204.

8th Grade Students: We do have an 8th grade program for those students who have already received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Parents, please register your 8th grade students so they can continue to learn about God and his Church.

TEACHERS NEEDED: We do need PREP teachers for the 2021 – 2022 school year. If you want to find out more information or you already know you want to volunteer (YAY!), please contact Annmarie at 215-493-5204 or 215-370-5701. Please don't assume that you can't teach. Most of our PREP teachers thought the same thing, and they are fantastic!

SACRAMENTS: (I know that several parents have some concerns about their children receiving the Sacraments during this time of Covid-19. Please don't hesitate to contact Annmarie with your concerns – 215-493-5204).

FIRST RECONCILIATION: If your child missed First Reconciliation on March 2, please contact Annmarie (215-493-5204) so we can set up another time.

FIRST COMMUNION: Please send in the \$25 Sacrament Fee as soon as possible. First Communion is scheduled for Saturday, April 17, 2021, at the 9:30 a.m. Mass and the 12:00 noon Mass. You will be receiving emails about rehearsal for First Communion as we get closer to that date.

CONFIRMATION: The candidate's paperwork, the sponsor's letter of eligibility, and the Confirmation fee is long past due. Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, April 24, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. Mass and 1:30 p.m. Mass, with Bishop John J. McIntyre. You will be receiving emails about rehearsal for Confirmation as we get closer to that date. Don't forget to contribute to the Bishop's choice of charity (St. John's Hospice – a shelter for homeless men).

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

This coming week we will be celebrating the feast of the Annunciation, one of the decades of the Joyful mysteries of the rosary and a very holy celebration of the 'yes' of our Blessed Mother. Have you ever pondered the event? Women can ask themselves 'if I were a 14 year old virgin and an angel appeared to me and called me blessed and told me I was going to be the mother of the Son of God', how would I react? Men, if you were St. Joseph and engaged/betrothed to Mary and found out she was pregnant what would you do? And then if an angel came and explained to you how that happened and that you were going to be the foster father of the Son of God, how would you respond? There are so many issues surrounding this great feast day that we could all make a reflection, we could spend the rest of Lent coming up with possible responses! Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Let us do an examination of conscience and consider reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the grace necessary to enter the Easter Triduum in a state of grace.

"To celebrate the Gospel of life means to celebrate the God of life, the God who gives life... In every child which is born and in every person who lives or dies we see the image of God's glory. We celebrate this glory in every human being, a sign of the living God, an icon of Jesus Christ" (The Gospel of Life 84).

Every week at every mass almost everyone in Church professes the Creed, a prayer which encapsulates all the beliefs taught by the Catholic Church about life/death and resurrection. Lent is a time to reflect on the meaning of these mysteries and the WHY of the death of Jesus and the great suffering He endured and the meaning of the Resurrection of the body. Yes! Your body is so holy and so of value that at the Second Coming of Jesus, you will be arisen from the dead and receive your resurrected body back...yes, the very one you are in now, but perfected and intact and having received those preternatural gifts lost at the original sin... infused knowledge, immortality and integrity of passions. These gifts correspond to intellect, free will, concupiscible appetite (temperance) and irascible appetite (fortitude). Lent could be a time for all to contemplate the meaning of their lives; it could be a time to allow the 'death of that part of self' that leads to sin. Death of self (kenosis) can lead to a metanoia (change of one's way of life resulting from penitence or spiritual conversion). Yes, that is it!

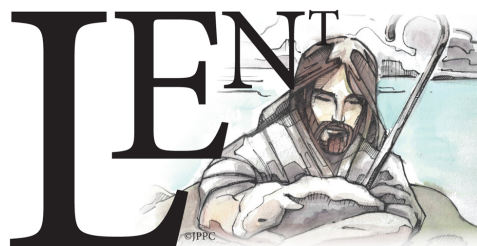

The Children's Liturgy of the Word has resumed with safety measures in place. All participants will be asked to wear masks/face shields. New Resources: Updated 3/15/21

ECONOMIC RESOURCES:

Pennsylvania Unemployment Compensation: You may be eligible for unemployment if your employer has closed due to COVID-19, your hours have been reduced, you have been told not to work, you have been laid off, or have been told to isolate or self-quarantine. Self-employed, independent contractors and freelancers also may be eligible for unemployment assistance through the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA program).

Important to note, under the American Rescue Plan (new federal economic stimulus law) just enacted, state unemployment benefits are increased by up to \$300/week through September 6th. The first \$10,200 worth of benefits in 2020 will be tax-free for those earning up to \$150,000. For more information or to apply, visit: <https://www.uc.pa.gov/Pages/default.aspx>

Direct Cash Payments: Under the American Rescue Plan, you may be eligible for a third stimulus check: you will receive a direct payment of \$1,400 if you earned up to \$75,000 (based on your 2019 tax return or 2020 return if filed) or \$2,800 if you and your spouse made up to \$150,000. You also may be eligible for an extra \$1,400 per dependent child, including children in college. Payments will decrease if you made over \$75,000, and will phase out completely if your income was \$80,000. Electronic payments are expected to be received as soon as the end of March, but if mailed, receipt will take longer.

Child Tax Credit (CTC): Under the new law, the CTC for children (17 and younger) increases from \$2,000 to up to \$3,600 for 2021, depending on parents' income and age of children.

HOUSING RESOURCES:

Eviction Moratorium: The federal eviction moratorium has been extended to March 31st, 2021.

Bucks County Housing Group: If you are a resident of Bucks County and facing eviction or homelessness, please contact the Bucks County Housing Link @ 1-800-810-4434 as you may be eligible for assistance.

FOOD RESOURCES:

SNAP Benefits/Food Stamps: You may be eligible for SNAP benefits (food stamps) to help buy food and groceries, due to a job loss/loss of income from the coronavirus pandemic. However, there are income limits, based on family size. Now you can also use SNAP to purchase groceries at some online retailers.
