

Reading I: Acts 9: 26-31

St. Paul not only witnesses the risen Jesus, but also has become His missionary. At the same time, Paul's conversion evidently brought peace to the Palestinian Church communities.

Reading II: I John 3: 18-24

God, being "greater than our hearts" still inspires confidence even if our consciences condemn us. As a result, we do what pleases Him.

The Gospel: John 15: 1-8

The vine and branch imagery includes an assurance from Jesus that the Word of God has made the disciples safe from pruning. When these disciples "bear fruit" as His emissaries they glorify the Father.




Whether it's your first time here or you have been coming to Mass here for years, we welcome you to join our parish. Please contact the rectory to register.

FISCAL CORNER

Included in this week's bulletin is a summary of our Fiscal Year 2022 Parish Budget that has been submitted to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This budget assumes collections will remain consistent and allows for expected planned increases in our expenses. In addition, this budget provides a planned payment towards the debt as well as a \$360,277 (or 21.73%) subsidy to the school. Overall we do have a positive outlook for the next fiscal year, but only with your help. Your consistent gifts to our parish allows us to carry out our mission, as well as make much needed improvements to our Church and School.
