

# May 16, 2021 The Seventh Sunday of Easter

# Reading I: Acts 1: 1-11

The presence of the two angels places the ascension of Jesus in a special category. The connection made with this event and the Second Coming of Christ puts the event beyond ordinary history. It ends Christ's time of physical presence and also the end of the Church's time.

# Reading II: Ephesians 4: 1-13, or 4: 1-7, 11-13

St. Paul asserts that we have all been gifted by the Holy Spirit and that there is both unity and diversity in the Church. This should promote a certain manner of life for us.

# The Gospel: Mark 16: 15-20

Jesus instructs His disciples to baptize all nations in His name. He also assures them that they will be seeing all kinds of wonderful signs of His abiding presence even after He "was taken up into heaven."



### SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE COLLECTION

Next weekend will be the second Social Action Committee collection of the year benefitting those less fortunate in our community. Recent requests for financial assistance have been acknowledged and we have assisted a parishioner with monetary assistance due to extreme unexpected medical expenses. Another situation involved Catholic Social Services who were asking us for help paying a client's PECO bill. This particular client was a young woman experiencing dire life threatening illness which no longer allowed her to work and threatened her energy supply. All local agencies were contacted but unable to help. Your generosity helped to defray some of this burden and to say that she was appreciative is an understatement. In another situation, a committee member who is a social worker at Jefferson asked for assistance with providing clothing for recently discharged homeless patients. Clothes were purchased at cost from the manufacturer at incredible savings and distributed as needed.

These are just a few examples of what your generosity has permitted us to do. Our other activities include purchasing and preparing and delivering monthly meals for the homeless through the Advocacy for the Homeless program. We continue to support Mary's Food Cupboard each month with your donations of non-perishable food items left at the church entrances or Adoration Chapel. We continue to support the Legacy of Life program and have been a source of emergency help for many parish families.

Please consider donating to this collection through the online giving program or by using the yellow envelope in your packet, if you still use this means of contributing. Donations have diminished over the pandemic but the needs of many have increased. Thank you for your support and God Bless You.

# Knights' Notes May 16, 2021

World War II ended in 1945. TWO HUNDRED NINTY TWO THOUSAND AMERICANS died in that combat. The many families who prayed their loved ones through those 4 years or lost their sons or daughters in the Pacific or in land battles in Europe or Africa are at least 75 years old today. Age does not diminish their pain and memories. Add to those deaths, the 87 thousands who died in more recent years, in the snows of Korea, the jungles of Viet Nam and the deserts of Afghanistan or Iraq. We must not forget these heroes ever. It is our solemn duty to honor their sacrifices and their patriotism. Memorial Day each year calls us to celebrate their bravery and our love of freedom and country.

St. Ignatius Parish has grown from and served the Yardley community for 100 years. We have lost our share of heroes in wars our country has endured over the last century. This year the Yardley Veterans of Foreign Wars has invited the St. Ignatius, Knights of Columbus Council to share in their plans to honor the deceased in a Memorial Day service on May 31st -- at the monument on the river, across from the Yardley Inn,- -at 9 am. Our parish Knights will also participate in the annual Memorial Day parade along Main Street later that day, at 11 a.m.. Any of our parish ministries who wish to join the Knights in the parade are invited to create their own identifying banner or sign, showing the widespread respect our parish has for our deceased heroes. We invite the Boy Scouts, the Caring For Friends Group, the Perpetual Adorers, the S..I. S. students, and any of our prayer groups to walk down Main St. proudly acknowledging our farreaching parish impact on the community and the everlasting respect our parish has for America's deceased heroes.

Even if parishioners care not to march in the parade, please join the spectators, cheer on the marchers, and say a silent prayer for the deceased American heroes.
