





### **SACRAMENTS:**

Here is a heads-up on dates for next year: Confirmation is scheduled with Archbishop Edward Adams on Saturday, March 19, 2022. First Penance will be on Tuesday, March 8, 2022. First Communion is scheduled for Saturday, April 30, 2022.

Confirmation Parent Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 21, at 7:00 p.m., in the auditorium under the Church. All parents of children who are preparing for the Reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation are expected to attend this meeting.

### **ROSARY**

All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00 Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.

The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. In the sobriety of its elements, it has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of the prayer of Mary, her perennial Magnificat for the work of the redemptive Incarnation which began in her virginal womb. With the Rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer.

Yesterday was the feast of the Guardian Angels. Have you ever contemplated that each and every one of us ever created is 'assigned'/given a guardian angel, one who stays with FORMATION us always, sees and knows all we do and is there to protect and guard and lead and love us until we return to our heavenly judgment and either reward or punishment. Have you ever

prayed to your guardian angel? Have you ever 'spoken to them' in the voice of your thoughts and heart? St. Jerome was the first to outline a specific scheme for guardian angels in that 'every soul is assigned a guardian angel the moment it was put into a body'.

The feast of the Guardian Angels was added to the liturgical calendar in the fifteenth century. Pope Francis has told us that 'no one travels alone', and, at times, when tempted we 'hear' an inner voice guiding us with right and wrong decisions- our guardian angel. Jesus has told us "I send an angel before you, to guard you, to accompany you on the way so you will not make a mistake". Perhaps, one of the reasons we do make mistakes is that we don't 'listen' to our guardian angels. Join us for our programs as they are all listed on the green trifolds at the entrances of the Church. "St. Joseph's 'yes' to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. October is Respect Life Month and we should spend time in reflection on fatherhood and the sacrifices that St. Joseph, father of Jesus, and a man of few words made on behalf of his spouse, Mary the Mother of God, and Jesus, his foster son. St. Joseph lends new meaning to the phrase 'dying to oneself' in that he unconditionally gave of himself, despite whatever desires or plans HE had, to the benefit of Mary and Jesus. He risked loss of reputation by defending and marrying a pregnant woman; he found a place for her to deliver Jesus when there was none available; he fled to Egypt on foot from Bethlehem and gave up his job, his family, his friends to go to a foreign land for the safety of Jesus and Mary; he stayed there 7 years; he taught Jesus his trade; he provided food, shelter, clothing and safety for both and the Bible does not report one word that he ever spoke nor any information about his death. Children need fathers (as well as mothers!) and, yet, fathers have seemed to have somewhat 'disappeared' from the modern family cultural landscape. We need to look to St. Joseph and model his fatherhood in our own families... truly respecting life and love.
