

Reading I: Wisdom 7: 7-11

Solomon's prayer exhibits his preference for holy Wisdom over power, riches, health, comeliness and light. A real challenge is here presented to the modern reader.

Reading II: Hebrews 4: 12-13

Addressed to pagan converts, the author asserts that God is both living and active, and shows Himself in Christ. We must someday render an account for our thoughts of the heart.

The Gospel: Mark 10: 17-30, or 10: 17-27

Three sections of Christ's teachings on wealth and the kingdom are presented here. (1) the story of the rich man; (2) Jesus' interaction with the disciples; (3) the rewards for giving up riches.
