2021-2022 Annual Parish Appeal Update:



As we leave respect life month, let us not forget to respect all life throughout the entire year from **FORMATION** conception to natural death. Our adult faith formation committee held a very excellent program

this past month which was a panel discussion on End of Life Issues by various members of the Catholic Medical Association including a palliative care physician who is also a Deacon, two, a volunteer in a hospice and a director of palliative care/hospice programs. Many don't know about palliative care which is actually a period of time before a person becomes so ill that they qualify for hospice. There are palliative care physicians and nurses. Hospice requires that a person has such a terminal illness that they probably won't survive more than 6 months. There are some terminal illnesses that can last longer, sometimes even years; these illnesses may not be curable but they may be supported/ameliorated and symptoms may be managed to allow the patients to be comfortable either at home or in a palliative care facility and these treatments are usually covered by insurance. Please look at our green trifold brochures to see the rest of our programs for the year into 2022. Our men's programs is still ongoing until December and can be joined at any time in our study of Corinthians every Wednesday at 7 PM in the Antioch center. Our Advent retreat will be Nov. 20. Join us.

CHILDRENS LITURGY OF THE WORD

Every Sunday at 9:30 Mass, children are invited downstairs to have their own Liturgy of the Word where the readings and homily are geared to their level of understanding. The children love listening to the readings from the Children's Lectionary and enjoy actively participating in the interactive homily and/or the lesson being discussed.

There are two volunteer positions needed each Sunday: facilitator and cantor. The facilitator guides the whole process, and the cantor leads the children in singing responses and monitors progress of Mass upstairs to determine our return. On two Sundays a month, Deacon Bob or Deacon Mike join us and they read the Gospel and give a homily. On the other Sundays, the facilitator reads the Gospel and offers reflections. (If reading the Gospel and offering reflections is not something you feel comfortable with, you can be scheduled on days when one of the deacons is present and/or select the "cantor" position.)

Our responsibilities include leading the children downstairs, reading the Sunday readings from the Children's Lectionary, leading the children in the Profession of Faith, and calling on the children as they share their intentions during the Prayers of the Faithful. The volunteers have a "script" and a Leader's Guide, so nothing needs to be memorized.

We use SignUpGenius® to make the schedule. Schedules are made at the start of each season. We recommend volunteering two Sundays per quarter, if possible, but invite you to choose the number of Sundays that works best for your family's schedule. Also, if a conflict should arise on one of your scheduled Sundays, there are plenty of volunteers available to switch. We would love to have you join the Children's Liturgy ministry. You are welcome to join us downstairs on any given Sunday to become more familiar with the Children's Liturgy of the Word.
