


### Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Blessed Michael McGivney Feast Day: August 13

The eldest son of an immigrant Irish family in Connecticut, young Michael left school at 13 to work in a brass factory making spoons. At 16 he began studies for the priesthood in Quebec, but was obliged to leave to help support the family when his father died. Michael completed his education in Baltimore, Maryland, and was ordained for the diocese of Hartford in 1877.

Assigned to St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Fr. McGivney was very active in parish and civic affairs, serving as director of public plays and fairs. He volunteered to become the guardian of Alfred Downes, a minor whose father had died leaving a large family in poverty. This situation as well as his own family's circumstances and that of other immigrants impressed on Fr. McGivney the need for lay Catholic men to establish a mutual aid society to provide financial assistance for their families if the primary wage earner died. Protestant fraternal groups already provided this type of life insurance protection for their members.

In 1882, Fr. McGivney formed the Knights of Columbus among a small group of St. Mary's parishioners to promote charity, unity, and fraternity, assisting widows and orphans. Because of the Knights' emphasis on serving Church, community and family, the organization grew and did not remain strictly parish-based. Patriotism was added as a founding principle in 1900.

Father McGivney died from pneumonia in 1890 and was buried in Thomaston, Connecticut. Later his body was moved back to St. Mary's in New Haven where it remains today. He was beatified in 2020.

# RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"We thank you, heroic mothers, for your invincible love! We thank you for your intrepid trust in God and in his love. We thank you for the sacrifice of your life" (EV 86). Evangelium Vitae (EV) is an encyclical authored by Pope St. JPII in 1995 on the feast of the incarnation of Mary, Mother of God. It is translated as "The Gospel of Life" and deals with issues pertaining to the sanctity of human life, including murder, abortion, euthanasia and capital punishment, reaffirming the Church's stances on said issues in a way generally considered consistent with previous Church teachings. A portion of it states that 'man is called to a fullness of life which far exceeds dimensions of his earthly existence, because it consists in sharing the very life of God'! The encyclical also addresses social and ecological factors, stressing the importance of a society which is built around the family rather than a wish to improve efficiency, and emphasizing the duty to care for the poor and the sick. Let us pray to Mary in this month honoring her Assumption into heaven for life, the dignity of the person, both born and unborn, and our families as they are being attacked every day. Let us dedicate this month to Mary and pray at least once to her every day for her intercession on attacks on life in our country and the world.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

Next month we will resume our in- person, live presentations of our programs for the upcoming Fall/Winter series. It has been a long time coming. Our men's program will begin on 9/14/2022 and will be in the Antioch center, second floor with a DVD presentation followed by small

As Pope St. JP II had stated in the beginning of his papacy, 'be not afraid' and that refrain is echoed in one of the more favorite hymns of many, 'be not afraid, I go before you always, come follow me, and I will give you rest'. One other September program will be "Truth and Tolerance" a great DVD presentation by Dr. Peter Kreeft on Saturday, September 24th at 9:30 AM in the Antioch center with coffee and tea. Our trifolds are at all the entrances of the Church with all of our year's programs. So, come follow He who is calling you.
