

The prophet offers wisdom by saying that truthful people are blest. He uses the idea common at that time of the just man being like a green tree.

Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20

Paul makes the point that what was done for Christ in His resurrection can be done for everyone who believes and tries to live His way.

The Gospel: Luke 6: 17, 20-26

Jesus' great sermon (on the plain) involves the listing of the beatitudes followed by that of the woes. The latter keep in check any facile decision we may make about who is or is not "the poor of God."

Saint Claude de la Colombière Feast Day: February 15th

This is a special day for the Jesuits, who claim today's saint as one of their own. It's also a special day for people who have a special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus—a devotion Claude de la Colombière promoted along with his friend and spiritual companion, Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. The emphasis on God's love for all was an antidote to the rigorous moralism of the Jansenists, who were popular at the time.

Claude showed remarkable preaching skills long before his ordination in 1675. Two months later, he was made superior of a small Jesuit residence in Burgundy. It was there he first encountered Margaret Mary Alacoque. For many years after he served as her confessor.

He was next sent to England to serve as confessor to the Duchess of York. He preached by both words and by the example of his holy life, converting a number of Protestants. Tensions arose against Catholics and Claude, rumored to be part of a plot against the king, was imprisoned. He was ultimately banished, but by then his health had been ruined.

He died in 1682. Pope John Paul II canonized Claude de la Colombière in 1992.



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"As disciples of Jesus, we are called to become neighbors to everyone (cf. Lk 10:29-37), and to show special favor to those who are poorest, most alone and most in need. In helping the hungry, the thirsty, the foreigner, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned—as well as the child in the womb and the old person who is suffering or near death—we have the opportunity to serve Jesus." (Pope Saint John Paul II, Evangelium vitae, 87.). Monday is Valentine's Day, a traditional secular holiday celebrating love. As Jesus tells us the two great commandments are to love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Do we think for one moment that some of the strife and division we currently see in our world is a result of loving our neighbors?

Have you ever read an encyclical? Do you know what an encyclical is? An encyclical is a papal letter sent to all bishops of the Roman Catholic Church. It is the highest form of communication by the Pope and usually deals with some aspect of Catholic teaching- clarifying, amplifying, condemning or promoting one or a number of issues. Evangelium Vitae (Gospel of Life) was promulgated March 25, 1995 and is a reflection and explanation of many topics regarding life. The Gospel of Life is at the heart of Jesus' message, and Pope St. JP II writes of the 'incomparable worth of the human person', ALL persons. We may not 'find' some people 'worth' loving, but we are called to hate the sin and love the sinner. So, as we prepare for a day celebrating love, don't just love those that are 'easy' to love, do something for someone who is 'difficult' to love and you will be 'serving Jesus'!
