


## Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Saint Maria Bertilla Boscardin Feast Day: February 26th

If anyone knew rejection, ridicule and disappointment, it was today's saint. But such trials only brought Maria Bertilla Boscardin closer to God and more determined to serve him.

Born in Italy in 1888, the young girl lived in fear of her father, a violent man prone to jealousy and drunkenness. Her schooling was limited so that she could spend more time helping at home and working in the fields. She showed few talents and was often the butt of jokes.

In 1904, she joined the Sisters of Saint Dorothy and was assigned to work in the kitchen, bakery and laundry. After some time Maria received nurses' training and began working in a hospital with children suffering from diphtheria. There the young nun seemed to find her true vocation: nursing very ill and disturbed children. Later, when the hospital was taken over by the military in World War I, Sister Maria Bertilla fearlessly cared for patients amidst the threat of constant air raids and bombings.

She died in 1922 after suffering for many years from a painful tumor. Some of the patients she had nursed many years before were present at her canonization in 1961.



As many of us are 'trapped' in the isolation and restrictions of this pandemic, anxiously awaiting our turn for vaccination (if so desired), we can have more time to spend in prayer and reading of Scripture. IF we can spend an average of 5 hours a day, or more, watching TV or on social media, we can take ONE of those hours, or more, in prayer and reading of Scripture. We are preparing for the season of Lent and typically the tradition is to fast from something; some even continue to fast from meat on Fridays. But it is not just fasting that we are called to do. We are also called to do something positive, or extra-ordinary, something outside our normal routines. After all, isn't that what Jesus did for us? Didn't He give His life for us out of love so that we may have life. Isn't that what women are called to do when they find themselves in the same situation as our Holy Mother Mary, pregnant with a child that they did not expect? So, those women in that situation are called to sacrifice themselves for the life of their child, as Mary did! And those of us not in that situation are also called to sacrifice to 'walk with Jesus' during this time as we prepare to celebrate His Crucifixion leading to the Resurrection.
