

Fear of the Lord will keep a person honest in business. Otherwise his or her integrity is lost.

Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 54-58

By humbly admitting our sins, we can persevere in doing the Lord's work. Paul stresses that our victory over death is due to Jesus Christ.

The Gospel: Luke 6: 39-45

Jesus warns those who view their own sins as minor offenses and others' sins as major ones should pay heed to the truth about themselves. The Sermon on the Plain ends with Jesus asserting that where our heart lies is the most significant factor in Godly living.

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics. (USCCB.ORG)



This week we will enter the Lenten season. Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter, the Resurrection of the Lord. It provides for a 40 day fast (Sundays excluded) in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began His public ministry. Christ gave us great example of what to do in

the face of temptation, rely on the Word of God! Try reading the Bible for 10 minutes a day; try skipping one meal a day; try visiting the Adoration chapel for 15 minutes once a week and present yourself to the very actual presence of the Lord (open daily M-F 10 Am to 8 PM). In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the RCIA for Adults. Contemplate the meaning and the origins of the Lenten fasting tradition. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts- not only through the distribution of money, but of time and talents. "The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs (the poor)" – St. John Chrysostom. Now is a great time to reflect, not just on the Super Bowl, but the 'super season' of the Catholic faith as we know who won, we know how the event went, and we know who the MVP was... Jesus, our Lord and Savior. You know what He did for you; what can YOU do for Him and His church?


