

Reading I: Isaiah 62: 1-5

God seems to have "grown impatient" (note the quotation marks) as He breaks forth, through His prophet in praise of Zion. He predicts how she shall shine among the nations of the world, and hold an attraction for Him, relatively small though she is.

Reading II: I Corinthians 12: 4-11

In response to a community problem, Paul outlines the variety of gifts that the Holy Spirit bestows on members, who remain distinct but still united with everyone else. These gifts enable the community to function as the Lord's joy.

The Gospel: John 2: 1-11

The first miracle of Jesus takes place at a wedding reception and is described by John as a "sign" that reveals Our Lord's glory, enough to encourage His early disciples to believe in Him.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



The Catholic bishops of the United States have designated January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, directs: In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. (January 19-27, 2022) 9 Days for Life is a novena for the protection of human life. Each day's intention is accompanied by a short reflection and suggested actions to help build a culture of life. Participants can receive the novena by subscribing to daily emails or text messages. (A printable version is also available online.). Sign up for the novena at www.9daysforlife.com.

Each year our Respect Life committee challenges our 8th grade students at St. Ignatius to write a 'prolife essay'. This year, we will be conducting that contest during Lent as a sacrificial offering for life and give awards on Mother's Day at the 9:30 AM Mass. Stay tuned!

CHILDREN'S LITURGY of the WORD

"Let the little children come to me..." Matthew 19:14



Every Sunday at 9:30 Mass, children are invited downstairs to have their own Liturgy of the Word where the readings and homily are geared to their level of understanding. The children love listening to the readings from the Children's Lectionary and enjoy actively participating in the interactive homily and/or the lesson being discussed.

There are two volunteer positions needed each Sunday: facilitator and cantor. The facilitator guides the whole process, and the cantor leads the children in singing responses and monitors progress of Mass upstairs to determine our return. On two Sundays a month, Deacon Bob or Deacon Mike join us and they read the Gospel and give a homily. On the other Sundays, the facilitator reads the Gospel and offers reflections. (If reading the Gospel and offering reflections is not something you feel comfortable with, you can be scheduled on days when one of the deacons is present and/or select the "cantor" position.)

Our responsibilities include leading the children downstairs, reading the Sunday readings from the Children's Lectionary, leading the children in the Profession of Faith, and calling on the children as they share their intentions during the Prayers of the Faithful. The volunteers have a "script" and a Leader's Guide, so nothing needs to be memorized.

We use SignUpGenius® to make the schedule. Schedules are made at the start of each season. We recommend volunteering two Sundays per quarter, if possible, but invite you to choose the number of Sundays that works best for your family's schedule. Also, if a conflict should arise on one of your scheduled Sundays, there are plenty of volunteers available to switch.
