

St. Blaise Feast Day: February 3rd

We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary Acts of St. Blaise were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were first surprised and then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears.

The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.



"Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life. Whatever storms or trials we face, we are not alone. He is with us. 'Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age' (Matthew 28:20)." Most women we see in our crisis pregnancy centers desire to terminate their pregnancies because they are afraid; many are desperate because they don't have support; some are being forced by family members or fathers of the baby. Most have no idea of what is involved in the abortion procedure, what the consequences may be and once we inform them with the truth and offer support and follow up for the baby and their families for 3 years, many decide for life. This is what we do. We offer a free pregnancy test to confirm the pregnancy. We bring them back for an ultrasound to confirm length of gestation and they see their babies on ultrasound, hear the heartbeats, see them moving and many cry and are joyful- almost like John the Baptist who leapt within the womb of Elizabeth when meeting Mary pregnant with Jesus! They receive counseling and support and many end with saying yes to life. In 2021 LOLF centers saved over 250 babies; in the past 12 years, over 3000. As we end this 'month of life' let's not cease to pray for life and support our crisis pregnancy centers- it IS a matter of life and death!
