


Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 3, 2022





Reading I: Isaiah 66: 10-14c

The prophet exhorts the people of the new Jerusalem to rejoice. He offers a lovely image of the people as God's children nursing at the breast of a "Mother" Jerusalem.

Reading II: Galatians 6: 14-18

In his resume, St. Paul boasts only of the Cross and Christ crucified. He expresses his own dependence always on God's grace.

The Gospel: Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20 or 10: 1-9

Jesus prepares His future messengers for their mission with wise instructions, including the offering of peace to the people they encounter. He also makes clear that they will meet resistance and even rejection, and how to handle that when it happens.



Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.





July is the seventh month of the year and the fourth of seven months to have a length of 31 days. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Julius Caesar, it being the month of his birth. Monday, July 1 was the feast day of St. Junipero Serra whose statue last year was displaced by an angry mob in CA

despite the fact that he founded the first missions in CA to protect the indigenous people in that area against those oppressing them. July 3 was the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle- he who doubted and evangelized India. July 4, the feast of St. Elizabeth of Hungary; July 6, we have the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr; July 11, the feast day of St. Benedict who founded the monastic rule and gave us the Benedictine Order; July 14, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American canonized saint; July 16, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel; July 21, St. Lawrence Brindisi, priest and doctor; July 22, St. Mary Magdalene; July 25, the feast of St. James the Apostle and the anniversary of Humane Vitae giving us Church teaching on human sexuality/contraception/ responsible parenthood and family planning; July 26, feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus; July 29, feast day of St. Martha and finally July 31, feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola. An all- star banner month, this month that starts with Independence Day celebrating the birth of our nation and such freedom of will and faith as manifested by the saints we celebrate.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"O God our creator... through the power and working of your Holy Spirit, you call us to live out our faith in the midst of the world, bringing the light and the saving truth of the Gospel to every corner of society."

There is a lot going on in our society right now as we are in the midst of celebrating Independence Day weekend over July 4. This day memorializes the Declaration of Independence and the birth of our nation as an independent nation. "We hold these truths to be self-evident that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness." The caps are in the original document. There are several references to God and the Creator. The first inalienable right mentioned is the right to LIFE without which NONE of the other rights would have any meaning. Liberty is a word that is different from freedom and both are radically different from license. Liberty entails the 'responsible' use of freedom under the rule of law without depriving anyone else of their freedom. Freedom is more broad in that it represents a total lack of restraint or the unrestrained ability to fulfill one's desires! License is permission to act and is usually regulated by law, like a driver's license or a fishing license. We HAVE liberty (free will) but freedoms are dictated by restraints and require responsibility. Let us pray to the Creator that we start with respecting life, love God and love our neighbor as ourselves. What we are doing is not working? We need a new plan! How about God's plan?

The first announcement of the Knights' plan to print a booklet of original haikus for our Centennial celebration appeared in the bulletin of January 19, 2020, The Knights asked parishioners of all ages to share cherished memories. The response was slow at first, but quickly took on steam as the challenge became a fun endeavor. When the Covid pandemic hit us, our church attendance took the hit. Fortunately, the school community took up the challenge and from our school families, the haikus poured in to complete the book. That was two and a half years ago. Called "A Hundred Haikus", the booklet's sales enabled the Knights to donate \$1200 to the parish. - A haiku is a form of poetry that the Japanese people perfected over 1000 years ago. It is creative thinking captured by adherence to some rigid rules of wording. A haiku is three lines of poetry limited to a total of only 17 syllables—- 5 in line 1, 7 in line 2, and 5 in line 3.
