Reading II: Colossians 1: 24-28

Part of the mystery of Christ is that He reaches us ordinarily through one another. Because of his stewardship of Christ, St. Paul rejoices even in his sufferings.

The Gospel: Luke 10: 38-42

Martha and Mary host Jesus. He tells them of "the one thing necessary," which is openness to His person and message. He cites Mary to her sister Martha for her having chosen "the better part" while He is present.

Saint Mary Magdalene Feast Day: July 22nd

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. Yet she could well be the patron of the slandered, since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36-50.

Most Scripture scholars today point out that there is no scriptural basis for confusing the two women. Mary Magdalene, that is, "of Magdala," was the one from whom Christ cast out "seven demons" (Luke 8:2)—an indication at the worst, of extreme demonic possession or possibly, severe illness.

Writing in the New Catholic Commentary, Father Wilfrid J. Harrington, O.P., says that "seven demons" "does not mean that Mary had lived an immoral life—a conclusion reached only by means of a mistaken identification with the anonymous woman of Luke 7:36." In the Jerome Biblical Commentary, Father Edward Mally, S.J., agrees that she "is not...the same as the sinner of Luke 7:37, despite the later Western romantic tradition about her."

Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means." She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.




PREP CLASSES for the 2022 - 2023 school year: Stop in the office if you need a Registration Form. Registration Forms have been emailed to our present PREP families.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Two years ago before the Covid virus disrupted our lives, our parish had demonstrated a strong devotion to Our Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. In fact, in 2017 we celebrated 20 consecutive years of Perpetual Adoration. Seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day, volunteers kept their commitment to spend one particular holy hour

each week in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the Adoration Chapel. We were organized and we fully intended to continue for many more years, and we did until Covid struck. Suddenly we had to discontinue our around the clock prayer teams in an effort to stop the spread of the virus.

After a while, we were able to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament outside, on an altar under the blue canopy of the school. We parked our cars in rows and prayed, with a deep appreciation for Our Lord's Real Presence in our midst.

After a few months we moved to the main church for Adoration where we could be inside, but have space for distancing. Someone was always present when the Blessed Sacrament was exposed in the monstrance. At this time, our Adoration team has moved back to the chapel with adorers scheduled from 10am to 8pm Monday through Friday.

We are seeking more volunteers. We would like to add Saturdays and Sundays to our schedule, and eventually have enough people so that we can again have Perpetual Adoration in our parish.

Open hours are posted on charts at the chapel entrance. Come and see the beautiful chapel with the new stained glass windows. All are invited to visit and experience the profound peace of being in the Presence of Jesus, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Blessed Sacrament.
