


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.





Today we celebrate Father's Day. This coming Friday we also celebrate the feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus which is a liturgical solemnity that falls 19 days after Pentecost on a Friday. The devotion is one of the most widely practiced and well-known Catholic devotions taking Jesus Christ's physical

heart as the representation of His Divine love for humanity. The feast can be traced to the 11th century. It marked the spirituality of St. Bernard of Clairvaux in the 12th century and of St. Bonaventure and St. Gertrude the Great in the 13th century. The very first liturgical feast was celebrated in 1670 through the efforts of St. John Eudes. In 1856 Pope Pius IX established the feast as obligatory for the whole church. The feast is also a special day of prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.

Father's day is a day honoring fatherhood and paternal bonds as well as the influence of fathers in society. It was founded in America by Sonora Smart Dodd in 1910. It does, however, date back to 1508 when it was celebrated on the feast of St. Joseph March 19. No small coincidence that these two are celebrated today! Let all fathers dedicate their fatherhood to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and His father, St. Joseph and pray for the strength to be the leaders/providers and protectors they were called to be. One of the more common problems of contemporary society is the absence of fathers from the home, whether it be physical/emotional/spiritual/economic presence which can lead to fragmentation of families and poor mentorship for sons/future men! 1 in 4 children currently live without a father in the home, leading to 63% of all youth suicides, 90% of all runaway and homeless youths, 85% of all children with behavioral disorders and 71% of all high school dropouts. Let us pray for fathers including those of children in the womb.



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"Through our prayers and through the intercession of St. Joseph, patron of fathers, may fathers come to know the irreplaceable role they hold in the lives of their children, and the responsibility they share in welcoming God's gift of new life! Many of us can celebrate our fathers because they are still with us, although we may still be in some separation because of pandemic restrictions, illness or distance; many of us do not have our fathers with us- we can still pray to them, for them and celebrate with memories their fatherhood and their 'yes' to our lives! Many in the prolife movement are very much into saving the babies and helping the moms, but oft times the fathers are absent or forgotten. We need to pray for those men; we need to support them too and call them to pray to St. Joseph for the strength and the courage to do what St. Joseph did- stand up for, support and provide and protect and love his betrothed who unexpectedly conceived during their engagement, and 'adopted' Jesus as his own son and led Him into the man Our Lord became so He could be Father to us all! Thank you, St. Joseph; thanks to all fathers. We celebrate you today. We honor you. We remember you. ALL of us have fathers. Thanks to our Heavenly Father for the gift of life and the gift of Fatherhood. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

CHRIS BEHOUNEK MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

On July 15th 2018, the Behounek Family tragically lost Christopher A. Behounek to suicide. Chris had been in a terrible automobile accident coming home to Yardley in February of that year. His car slid off the road on a cold night and he struck a tree head-on. He was fortunate to survive the crash, but his injuries were many, including a severe concussion, a skull fracture, a neck injury and a shattered clavicle. The concussion he sustained was the latest of at least a few he had experienced playing sports and snowboarding. As medicine is now more aware of than ever, serial concussions are very dangerous to the individual even after the acute episode resolves. Over the next several months, he was making substantial progress recovering from his physical injuries, but he then developed very debilitating post-concussion syndrome with consequential major insults to his emotional health. He lost his battle and we lost him in July.

Chris was a vibrant young man, a wonderful person and an extremely avid golfer. He was very loving, kind, thoughtful and always considerate of others. Everybody loved Chris. He made an impact wherever he went. The members of the Behounek Family (Bruce, Diane, Matt and Chris) have been parishioners at St. Ignatius since 1990. Both Matt and Chris attended St. Ignatius School and then went on to study at St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia before going to the University of Delaware where they majored in Finance. Both benefited greatly by being long-term members of the St. Ignatius community and growing up in Yardley.

In the aftermath of the loss of Chris, his brother Matt, his sister-in-law Danielle, other members of his family and his close friends set out to create a fitting memorial to him and the Chris Behounek Memorial Golf Tournament (CBMGT) was born. The 4th annual CBMGT will be held on June 23rd 2022 at the Makefield Highlands Golf Club in Yardley PA. The first three tournaments have been very successful, resulting in proceeds of over \$105,000 that have been donated to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) to support their efforts to curb the spread of the major endemic public health problem of suicide in America.

While the tournament and dinner have filled up for this year, we are still accepting monetary contributions in memory of Chris. The success of the tournament depends not only on the participants and dinner attendees, but also on the many donors and sponsors who support it.
