

Third Sunday in Lent





Reading I: Exodus 3: 1-8a

Moses receives God's call to lead the Israelites out of Egypt and slavery to freedom in a new land. At the burning bush on the mountaintop he asks God for His name, and he is told the mysterious "I am who I am." It is a name that points to "free choice and unhindered power."

Reading II: I Corinthians 10: 1-6, 10-12

St. Paul warns his Corinthian converts not to be overconfident in themselves. They too can be as vacillating as the Israelites in the matter of living as God wants.

The Gospel: Luke 13: 1-9

This passage, unique to Luke, teaches us that God is truly compassionate but not indecisive. Everyone must do penance for sin. The fig tree parable is meant to energize all procrastinators to wake up and do penance as a matter of urgency.

St. Oscar Romero Feast Day March 24th

The night before he was murdered while celebrating Mass, Archbishop Oscar Romero of San Salvador said on the radio: "I would like to appeal in a special way to the men of the army, and in particular to the troops of the National Guard, the police, and the garrisons. Brothers, you belong to our own people. You kill your own brother peasants; and in the face of an order to kill that is given by a man, the law of God that says 'Do not kill!' should prevail.

"No soldier is obliged to obey an order counter to the law of God. No one has to comply with an immoral law. It is the time now that you recover your conscience and obey its dictates rather than the command of sin. . . . Therefore, in the name of God, and in the name of this long-suffering people, whose laments rise to heaven every day more tumultuous, I beseech you, I beg you, I command you! In the name of God: 'Cease the repression!'"

Simultaneously, Romero had eloquently upheld the gospel and effectively signed his own death warrant.

When he was appointed archbishop of San Salvador in 1977, Bishop Romero was considered a very "safe" choice. He had served as auxiliary bishop there for four years before his three years as bishop of Santiago de Maria.

Oscar's father wanted him to be a carpenter—a trade for which he demonstrated some talent. Seminary classes in El Salvador preceded his studies at Rome's Gregorian University and his ordination in 1942. After earning a doctorate in ascetical theology, he returned home and became a parish priest and later rector of an interdiocesan seminary.

Three weeks after his appointment as archbishop, Romero was shaken by the murder of his good friend Jesuit Father Rutilio Grande, a vigorous defender of the rights of the poor. Five more priests were assassinated in the Archdiocese of San Salvador during Romero's years as its shepherd.

When a military junta seized control of the national government in 1979, Archbishop Romero publicly criticized the US government for backing the junta. His weekly radio sermons, broadcast throughout the country, were regarded by many as the most trustworthy source of news available.

Romero's funeral was celebrated in the plaza outside the cathedral and drew an estimated 250,000 mourners.

On February 3, 2015, Pope Francis authorized a decree recognizing Oscar Romero as a martyr for the faith. His beatification took place in San Salvador on May 23, 2015, and he was canonized on October 14, 2018.

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.



We are excited to share with you that our parish is going to participate in a parish survey conducted by Catholic Leadership Institute! The Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey allows parishioners to reflect on their own spiritual growth and discipleship and identify the ways in which the parish effectively supports that growth.

The web-based survey will be accessible online at https://portal.catholicleaders.org/d/y0dc63 and in paper form from March 2nd to April 4th . It will take about 10- 15 minutes to complete and Catholic Leadership Institute recommends that only individuals 18 years of age and older complete the survey.

At the completion of the survey, our parish will receive an aggregate report of the results. We will NOT have access to individual survey responses. This survey offers us a unique and important opportunity to learn about issues of importance to families in a confidential and professional way. We will use these results to 1) look at opportunities to support parishioner growth in discipleship and 2) create goals and action plans to achieve that growth. St. Joseph is known to all as the foster father of Jesus and although he has no recorded speaking parts in the Bible, he 'spoke' through his actions of caring for the Holy Family and working hard to support them and risking his life and reputation to follow the directions of God through messenger angels. He

is the patron saint of the Universal church and families, fathers, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen and engineers and working people. Symbols associated with him are a carpenter's square and lily symbolizing his trade and his purity. We just finished a year long celebration dedicated to St. Joseph. He is descended from loyal lineage in the family line of King David. Friday, March 25 is the feast of the Annunciation of Our Lord; it is one of the twelve great feasts of the church year. The day is 9 months prior to the birthday of Jesus; this day represents the feast of the conception of Jesus in the womb of Mary through the Holy Spirit upon the announcing to her of her being chosen to be the Mother of Jesus. Pope St. JP II established this date as the International Day of the Unborn Child in commemoration of the conception of Jesus. This is truly a day of commemoration and celebration. We should give thanks to Mary for her yes, thanks to the Holy Spirit for His facilitating the Incarnation and to Jesus for His becoming a human person to show us the way, tell us the Truth and be the light of the world.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"To celebrate the Gospel of life means to celebrate the God of life, the God who gives life... In every child which is born and in every person who lives or dies we see the image of God's glory. We celebrate this glory in every human being, a sign of the living God, an icon of Jesus Christ" (The Gospel of Life 84). When you look at others, do you see Christ? Do you see the very image in which they were created? Or, do you see some worldly 'feature' whether good or bad, and, is that how you may approach or think about them, and choose to love them or not? We are in this world, but we are called to be not OF this world. We were created by God so we could share in His overflowing love. We are the only of His creation created in His image and likeness and given physical bodies. Our bodies are a sacramental reflecting the image of God; they make visible what is invisible and we were created for relationship or communion. The man/woman creation and how they were created and the meaning of the marital embrace is all about unity and procreation. We are called to 'co-create' and bring new life into the world through marital unity and these aspects of 'communion' between the husband and the wife are reflections and tastes of communion with the Trinity. All of these elements are explained in Pope St. JP II's "Theology of the Body" - 129 talks given on the meaning of the body and the meaning of human sexuality in his first 5 years of papacy and meant to explode in this century to combat all of the evils of diminution of the human person (body and spirit) through abortion, contraception, transgender ideology, physician assisted suicide/ personal suicide and other ills of our time. We need to become aware of these teachings, teach our children and know that upon the Second Coming, we will ALL get our resurrected bodies back for all of eternity to either dwell in communion with the Trinity or in the absence of God (hell) and the suffering that goes with that absence.
