
Fourth Sunday of Easter

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.



Congratulations to our First Communion students who received Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time this weekend. May they always be excited to welcome Jesus into their hearts.




