

FEAST DAY MAY 15TH

Isidore has become the patron of farmers and rural communities. In particular, he is the patron of Madrid, Spain, and of the United States National Rural Life Conference.

When he was barely old enough to wield a hoe, Isidore entered the service of John de Vergas, a wealthy landowner from Madrid, and worked faithfully on his estate outside the city for the rest of his life. He married a young woman as simple and upright as himself who also became a saint—Maria de la Cabeza. They had one son, who died as a child.

Isidore had deep religious instincts. He rose early in the morning to go to church and spent many a holiday devoutly visiting the churches of Madrid and surrounding areas. All day long, as he walked behind the plow, he communed with God. His devotion, one might say, became a problem, for his fellow workers sometimes complained that he often showed up late because of lingering in church too long.

He was known for his love of the poor, and there are accounts of Isidore's supplying them miraculously with food. He had a great concern for the proper treatment of animals.

He died May 15, 1130, and was declared a saint in 1622, with Saints Ignatius of Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila, and Philip Neri. Together, the group is known in Spain as "the five saints."

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.



- 3) Monday weekly from September to first week in May (6:30 p.m. -7:45 p.m.)



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"Patients need to be able to trust their doctors to always care for their lives and never deliberately cause death... SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE COLLECTION

The next collection for the Social Action Committee will be held the weekend of May 21st and 22nd. This committee recently celebrated 30 years of service to the St. Ignatius community, meeting the financial challenges of those individuals or families less fortunate in our parish. Yes, financial instability does exist, even here. Since the new year, we have assisted eight families with utility expenses, groceries, and other basic living needs. We are so grateful for the financial support of our church community and assure you that any money donated will always be used carefully and with due diligence.

The Social Action Committee continues to support the Advocates for the Homeless program in Bucks County with monthly meals prepared in either our home kitchens or the church kitchen. We have purchased clothing and boots for their clients when necessary. We continue to support Catholic Social Services with emergency assistance when needed. Mary's Food Cupboard is a weekly assistance program for Catholic Social Services and several of our volunteers collect and deliver weekly all donations that parishioners leave at the church entrances or at the chapel. Other annual collections which we sponsor include the Stuff the Bus (school supplies for needy children), the Sweater and Coat and the Turkey Drive at Thanksgiving. A fun activity we recently sponsored was the Easter Egg Hunt.
