
## Sixth Sunday of Easter

### Reading I: Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29

Through prayer and consultation, the early Church resolves the thorny question of whether Gentile converts have to observe Jewish cultural rituals. The answer was negative because this would put an unnecessary burden on them.

### **Reading II: Revelation 21: 10-14, 22-23**

All the nations, as noted in today's Responsorial, are called to dwell in a glorious and heavenly Jerusalem, founded on the Lamb and His twelve apostles.

### **The Gospel: John 14: 23-29**

Jesus promises that the Father and He will dwell among them but not as Jesus has up until then. He also promises to send "the Advocate" the Holy Spirit, who will teach them all they need to know.



Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.


