Reading I: 2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-14

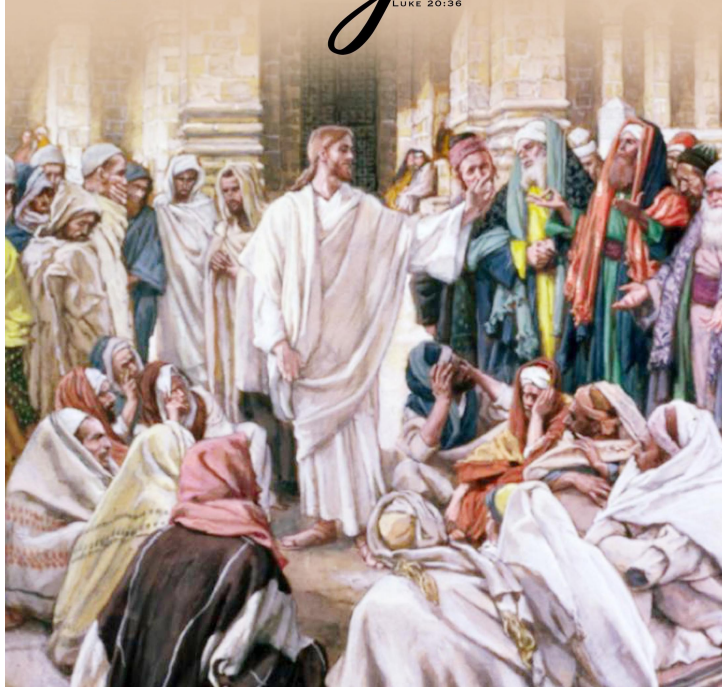
Women and children were also willing to die for the sake of the Law. These brothers, building on one another's strength, proclaim to the king that life is stronger than death.

Reading II: 2 Thessalonians 2: 16- 3: 5

The phrase "good hope" was used by pagan mystery religions that surrounded the Christians to express happiness after death. Here Paul "Christianizes" it, by connecting hope to connect with the eternal consolation that the risen Christ provides.

The Gospel: Luke 20: 27-38, or 27: 34-38

Jesus affirms His authority to the mocking Sadducees by declaring that it is God who both gives and sustains life after death. He proclaims His resurrection also.

FISCAL CORNER

Our 2022-2023 Annual Parish Appeal is underway! This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. You should have received our appeals materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church. Please return your donation by placing this year's appeal envelope in the collection basket at Mass. You may also mail your contribution or drop it off directly to the rectory. As of week #5 of the Parish appeal, 144 families have contributed \$50,585 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 33.72% of this year's goal and are \$26,385 behind last year's pace. RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



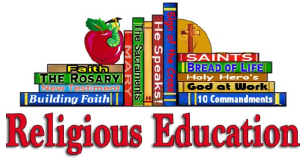
“Those who die in God’s grace and friendship live forever with Christ. Heaven is a true and lasting relationship with God that is beyond all earthly description and understanding.”

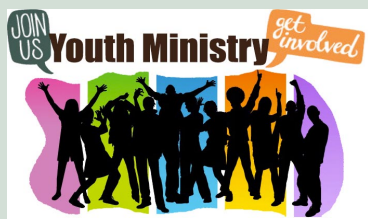

UPCOMING SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE COLLECTION

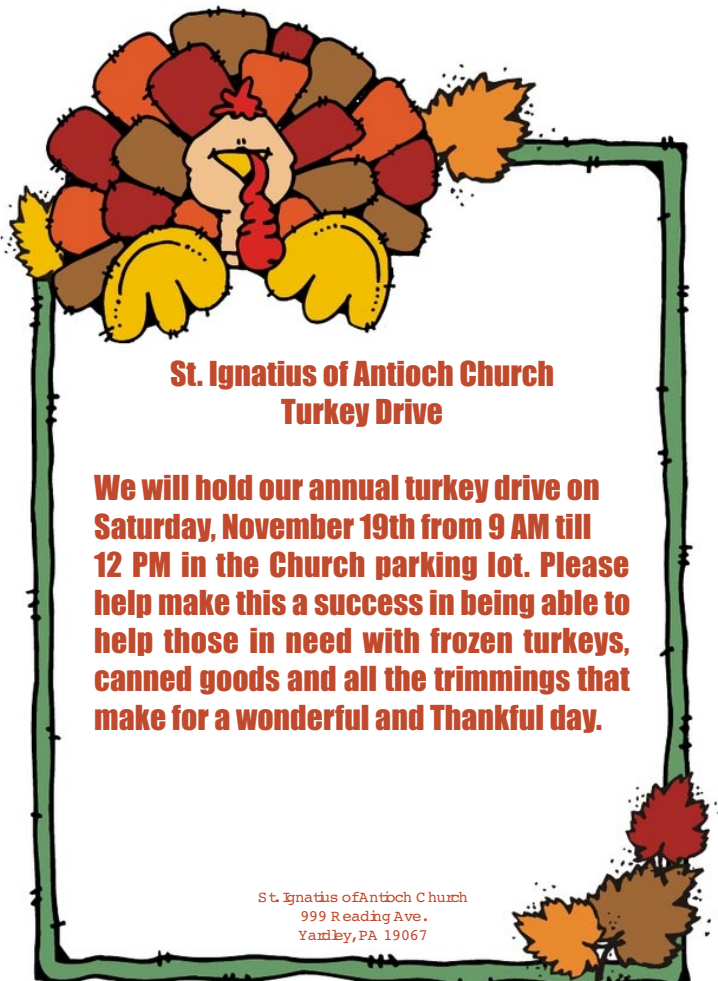
