

FISCAL CORNER


As of week #6 of the Parish appeal, 163 families have contributed \$60,785 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 40.52% of this year's goal and are \$20,985 behind last year's pace. As of 11/7/22 we are projected to be \$21,390 short of our goal. If you can make a contribution towards this critical fundraiser, we would appreciate your support of this fundraiser!

Our Advent retreat has been renewed for this year. Due to COVID, like so many other programs cancelled two years ago as we could not in good faith bring together large groups of people to prepare for one of the most important seasons of the liturgical year. But we can NOW, and

we ARE! There are several things one can do to prepare. Prepare an Advent calendar and wreath. Make a gift idea list, a budget and timeline, including spiritual bouquets and prayers as gifts. Decide what is important. Make a good examination of conscience and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Pray daily; read Scripture perhaps Luke and the Nativity stories- do so as a family. Set up a nativity scene in your home and pray in front of it as often as you can. A gift of self to Jesus would be a great gift; discern through prayer and fasting how to make a gift of oneself- one has to die unto oneself in order to allow a 'renewal' of life, at least spiritually, through the gifts of the Holy Spirt, the Sacraments and grace. The Incarnation of God to become man and walk among us, live like us and show us how to live and the armor we need to defend ourselves and His Church to guide us is the greatest gift He could give us other than the gift of life. He gave Himself to and for us, can't we consider giving one as valuable back? Ourselves? Our Advent retreat will be Saturday, Nov 19, 2022 featuring Bill Donaghy of the Theology of the Body Institute giving two talks on the Incarnation and the meaning and holiness of the body. Join us next Saturday beginning with 8:30 AM mass followed by break-fast and the presentations.



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

"Through the Church's teaching, God invites us to a fuller, richer, deeper way of life and love." If you are asking yourself the question 'is my life full?', 'is it rich?', 'is it deep?' and you don't have answers then maybe you are looking in the wrong place for those answers. 



