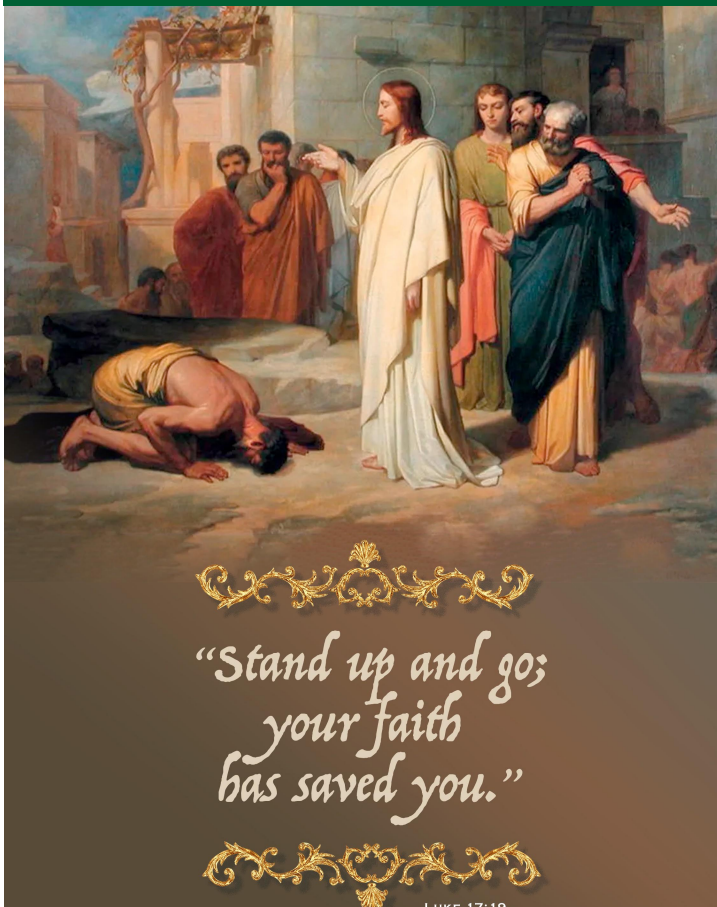

## Reading I: II Kings 5: 14-17

Elisha uses his healing power on behalf of his Gentile friend. Naaman of Syria, a leper. Elisha rejects Naaman's gift to show him it was really God who had healed him.

## Reading II: II Timothy 2: 8-13

Paul suffers for the gospel. He quotes an ancient hymn used by the various churches that he founded. The hymn contains a set of "Reliable statements" both synonymous and powerful.

## The Gospel: Luke 17: 11-19

Luke is the only evangelist to tell us this wonderful story of a healing miracle worked for a Samaritan, a member of the group so hated by contemporary Jews. Luke wants to stress the teaching more than the miracle itself. We can mark the event as the Samaritan's conversion.

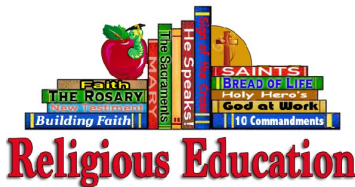

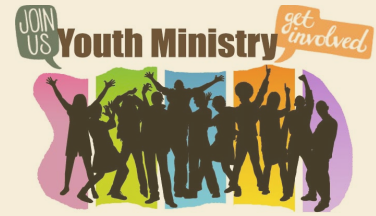
