



Reading I: Exodus 17: 8-13

Moses defeats the fierce Amalekites by stretching out over them the same rod with which he had defeated Pharaoh. But Yahweh uses this tool to help only when Moses holds the rod aloft.

Reading II: II Timothy 3: 14-4:2

Through Timothy's effort St. Paul urges the community to retain what they have learned from him. He notes that all Scripture, referring to the Old Testament of course, is inspired and useful for teaching. The same holds for the New Testament, yet to be written down in Paul's time

The Gospel: Luke 18: 1-8

Jesus teaches His disciples and us, the power of prayer. He does it with a story about a persistent widow and her power over a corrupt judge. Important to remember that in those days a widow was nearly powerless in a male-dominated society. Our Lord wants us to pay attention to that fictional judge's remarks.

FISCAL CORNER

Our 2022-2023 Annual Parish Appeal is underway! This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. You should have received our appeals materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church. Please return your donation by placing this year's appeal envelope in the collection basket at Mass. You may also mail your contribution or drop it off directly to the rectory. As of week #2 of the Parish appeal, 56 families have contributed \$16,185 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 10.79% of this year's goal and are \$17,815 behind last year's pace. In response to God's call to holiness, our faith and life as adult disciples are grounded in developing a personal relationship with Jesus, "the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:69, Mk 1:24). Accordingly, "at the heart of catechesis we find, in essence, a Person, the Person of Jesus of Nazareth. . . . ' Cat-

echesis aims at putting 'people . . . in communion . . . with Jesus Christ."

As its first goal, faith formation helps adults "to acquire an attitude of conversion to the Lord." This attitude fosters a baptismal spirituality for adults. It leads them to recognize and repent of sin in their hearts and lives, to seek reconciliation through the sacraments, and to embrace the invitation and challenge of an ever-deepening faith in Jesus. It means putting on the mind of Christ, trusting in the Father's love, obeying God's will, seeking holiness of life, and growing in love for others. Deepening personal prayer is a significant means toward growth in holiness in daily life. As adult believers, we learn and live our faith as active members of the Church. Our response to God's call to community "cannot remain abstract and unincarnated," but rather, "reveals itself concretely by a visible entry into a community of believers . . . a community which itself is a sign of transformation, a sign of newness of life: it is the Church, the visible sacrament of salvation." People find this community of faith in the parish and diocese, as well as in their families, small church communities, personal relationships, faith-based associations, and in the communion of saints of all times and places.

Accordingly, faith formation helps adults make "a conscious and firm decision to live the gift and choice of faith through membership in the Christian community," accepting "co-responsibility for the community's mission and internal life." Adults not only receive the ministries of the Christian community, they also contribute to its life and mission through the generous stewardship of their gifts. Why not join us? 
