

The Lord hears the cry of the poor, the orphan and the widow. They are the three important, and even privileged groups in the Bible.

Reading II: II Timothy 4: 6-8

Paul uses the symbol of a libation to announce what he believed was his imminent death. He hands on his legacy to his beloved Timothy. He never lets his circumstances preclude his trust in God's vindication.

The Gospel: Luke 18: 9-14

Only Luke presents this famous parable to us. It is Jesus' response to self-righteousness. We admire the despised tax collector for his humility and example of prayer.

FISCAL CORNER

Our 2022-2023 Annual Parish Appeal is underway! This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. You should have received our appeals materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church. Please return your donation by placing this year's appeal envelope in the collection basket at Mass. You may also mail your contribution or drop it off directly to the rectory. As of week #3 of the Parish appeal, 87 families have contributed \$27,410 toward our goal of \$150,000. We are at 18.27% of this year's goal and are \$15,015 behind last year's pace. 

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

There is no healing without forgiveness and one has to forgive oneself, receive forgiveness from our Heavenly Father, because He loves us unconditionally and resolves and heals our wounds. There possibly can be no deeper wound than the loss of one's child through mechanisms of one's personal choice. These 'choices' are mostly related to fear or coercion. Thanks be to God that we have Rachel's Vineyard and Project Rachel which offer counseling, retreats, resources and guidance for healing of both men and women from abortion of their children. While the 'act' of conceiving may not be marital or may be 'forced' ALL of the children so conceived, regardless of circumstance, are part of God's plan for salvation and have an important role and purpose in this world and NEED to be allowed to be born. If the parents of these children are not able or willing to parent, then adoption is the best option and there are many resources that are available to counsel and guide in that direction.
