


Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Wisdom 9: 13-18b

This is part of Solomon's prayer, in which he acknowledges that all of our deliberations are weak because of our bodily concerns. Therefore, who of us can really know the Lord's ways?

Reading II: Philemon: 9-10, 12-17

Paul asserts that Philemon's slave Onesimus has become like a son to him. Now that he is a Christian, he will be coming back to his owner a better person, a true disciple of the Lord and one who forgives injuries.

The Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33

This section embraces Luke's conditions for being a disciple. A person must necessarily consider those before taking any action. Above all, a true disciple must follow through on his/her resolve to the end.





PREP CLASSES for the 2022 - 2023 school year: Stop in the office if you need a Registration Form. Registration Forms have been emailed to our present PREP families.

- 1) Sunday weekly from September 11 to first week in May (10:35 a.m. 11:50 a.m.)
- Monday weekly from September 12 to second week in May (6:30 p.m. 7:45 p.m.) The Summer portion of the weeklong PREP has concluded. These students will continue their classes one Sunday a month (10:35 a.m. 12:25 p.m.). The dates are 9/11, 10/9, 11/13, 12/11, 1/8, 2/12, 3/12, 4/16, and 5/7. (Please keep a copy of these dates). When you signed up for the Summer program, you agreed to the Sunday classes as well. They are NOT optional.

If any parent would like to volunteer as a PREP Classroom Aide or Door Monitor, we would be so grateful. Please call me ASAP.

There will be a special PREP class for students in grades 8-11 (Fee is \$50 per student). This class will take place on Tuesdays, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:15 p.m. The class is based on the program Decision Point.

We use a video and group discussions on how to live your Faith as a teenager.
