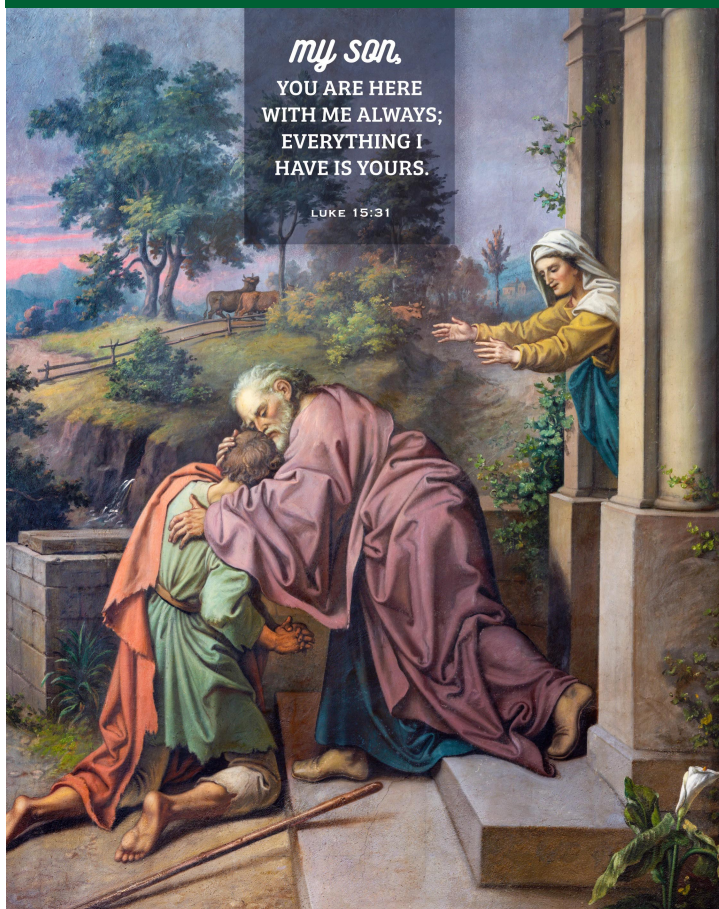

## Reading I: Exodus 32: 7-11, 13-14

Yahweh tells Moses, still on the mountaintop, about His people's apostasy down below, and His plan to destroy them. But Moses intercedes and persuades Yahweh to relent and remember His promises to the patriarchs.

## Reading II: I Timothy 1: 12-17

Paul, using himself as an example, boldly asserts to Timothy his friend that "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners."

## The Gospel: Luke 15: 1-32, or 15: 1-10

Luke selects 3 of Jesus' parables to illustrate how God's mercy allows Him to delight in people who turn back to Him after they have made bad choices to sin.

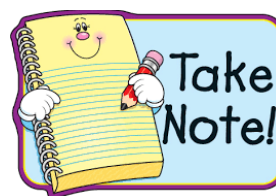
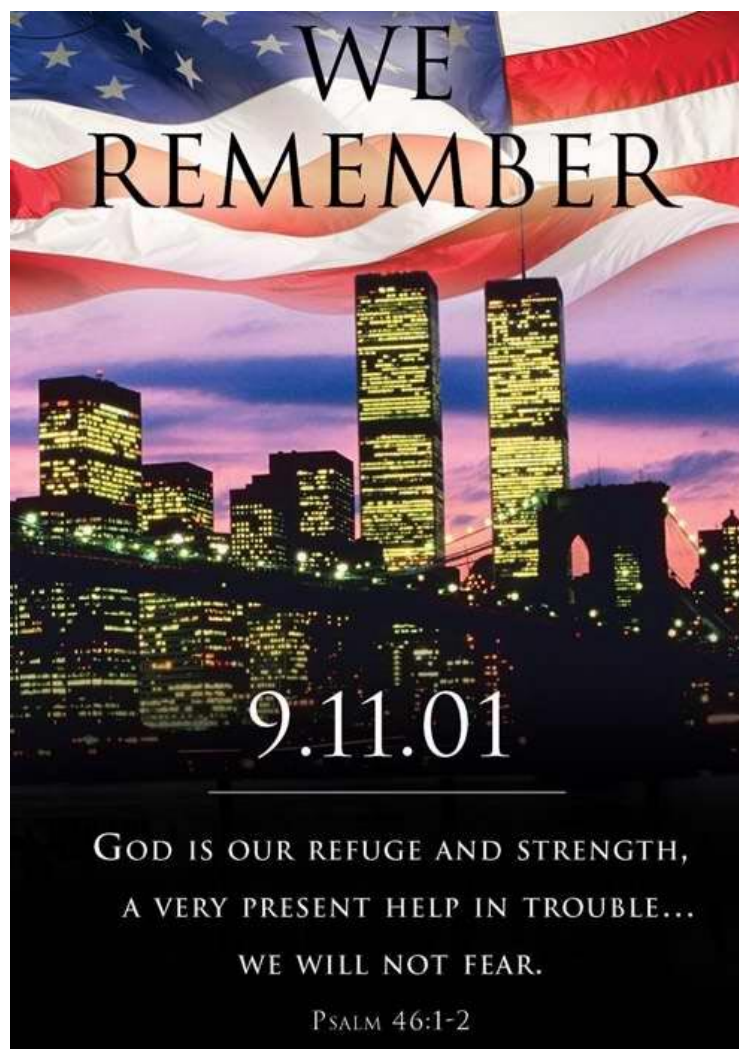

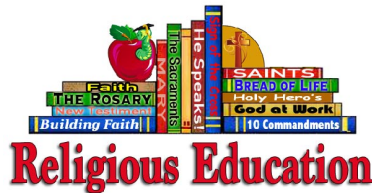
