

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 18, 2022





Reading I: Amos 8: 4-7

The prophet condemns the hypocrites who only observe the sabbath by not working on the day of the new moon, but quickly plot to cheat the poor people by their clever use of various weights.

Reading II: I Timothy 2: 1-8

Paul urges the community to pray for the emperor and other civil authorities to prove to their critics that they are not anti-government. The one true God desires that all human beings be saved.

The Gospel: Luke 16: 1-13, or 16: 10-13

The shrewd steward here is an embezzler who uses his soon to be lost position to prepare for his future. He is an example of how people who live by the present day culture at least have enthusiasm for their work. Jesus contrasts this with the dull response to God's kingdom by some of His own disciples, the socalled "sons of light."

We just celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Our Lady of the Seven Dolors, Our Lady of Piety, Mother of Sorrows all related to the seven sorrows of Mary's immaculate and holy life. Mary is usually represented in art in a mournful state, in tears, with a bleeding heart and pierced by seven daggers. Those seven sorrows are: 1. The prophecy of Simeon. 2. The flight into Egypt 3. The loss of the Christ Child in the Temple 4. Mary's meeting Jesus on the Way of the Cross 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus 6. The Piercing of the Side of Jesus with a Spear 7. The burial of Jesus. It is common for Catholics to say ONE OUR FATHER AND SEVEN HAIL MARYS FOR EACH DOLOR. This feast is the basis of devotion of the Servite Order or the Servite Friars aka as the Order of the Servants of Mary. The black scapular is representative of these sorrows. Many names are derived from this feast including Dolores, Dolorita, Lola and Pia. Let us pray to our Lady and imagine her suffering if we as parents had to endure these events for one of our children. Many parents have lost children for one reason or another; let us look and pray to Mary as she, too, lost her child who was crucified before her very eyes. Our men's program began this past Wed., but its not too late so why not join us- we will be in the 'upper room' of the Antioch center at 7 PM with a DVD on the Gospel of Matthew followed by small discussion groups.

Rose of Life Intention: For all who feel lost, that they may be found.








Welcome Back Beef and Beer Saturday, September 24th at 6:00PM
